




Preferred Community Development Scenario and Transportation Priorities

Transportation Priorities - Recap

Previously, organized potential improvements into three categories:

- 1. Potential Major/Local Street Improvements
- 2. Potential Bike Network Improvements
- 3. Potential Bus Network Redesign








Potential Major/Local Street Improvements

This map identified:


- Major streets in need of pedestrian crossings, sidewalk infill, intersection improvements, etc.
- Local streets in need of traffic calming, sidewalk infill, stop signs, etc.
- Traffic calming areas where speed management is needed
- Streets that should be further considered for paving upgrades



Potential Bike Network Improvements

This map highlighted:


- Existing/funded bike lanes and neighborhood greenways
- Potential new/upgraded bike lanes
- Potential new neighborhood greenways and where paving is necessary



Potential Bus Network Improvements

This map showed potential route changes to the bus network:

- Continuous service on Woodstock Boulevard/ eliminating service on Duke Street
- Continuous north-south service on 72nd Avenue with some loss on Harold Street
- Continuous service on Flavel Street



Based on community feedback and aligned with proposed land use changes, we developed the following potential projects:

13 Neighborhood Greenways

15 Corridor Improvements

11 Local Street Improvements




Neighborhood Greenways are **calm**, **low-speed shared neighborhood streets** that connect people to community destinations.





Corridor improvements focus on reducing speeding and improving comfort of people traveling along and across busier streets in the neighborhood.





Local street improvements improve connectivity, safety, and comfort within neighborhoods, providing safe and accessible spaces for pedestrians and bringing traffic to safer speeds.





For each project, a project sheet has been developed describing the project and nearby attractions/facilities.

Included project elements are currently general and non-specific. Priority projects will be more fully developed.




52nd Avenue (Duke-Flavel)


- 48′ wide
- Scheduled for repaving



52ND (DUKE-FLAVEL) Parking Protected Bike Lane Option



52ND (DUKE-FLAVEL) Buffered/Protected Bike Lane Option




52nd Avenue (North of Duke)

- 40' wide curb-to-curb
- To improve bike facilities, full parking removal necessary




52ND AVENUEBuffered/Protected Bike Lanes






72nd Avenue

- 40′ wide curb-to-curb
- Adding bike facilities requires full parking removal or having substandard bike facilities (like currently on 52nd Avenue)
- Parking removal could inhibit development
- Alternatives include 60s and 70s neighborhood greenways










East-West Neighborhood Greenway

- Even with recommended improvements, there is still a gap in the east-west bikeway network between Ramona and Knapp
- Could extend Tolman NG (NG.5) to 42nd, but would require paving multiple blocks
- Other alternatives?








Upgrading Gravel Streets

- We've reduced the number of gravel streets recommended for paving, but some would still benefit for bike network connectivity, accessibility, and traffic circulation
- Currently reviewing various alternative street designs that could be employed in Brentwood-Darlington
- Other alternatives/ideas?



Concept designs adopted in the Tryon-Stephens Headwaters Neighborhood Street Plan








Transit

- Over the summer, TriMet has been analyzing potential bus network changes to better serve the community
- Project is called "Forward Together"
- TriMet considered the Lower SE Rising analysis and feedback
- Many of the Forward Together recommendations align with ours
- Recommended changes will be made public soon
- PBOT will do additional analysis to inform feedback to TriMet on their proposal



Transit network redesign proposed as part of the online open house




Moving to Prioritization

- Next step in process is determining what are the highest priority projects
- To do so, need to determine prioritization factors
- Will use factors to develop a Tier 1/2 list of projects
- More project development will occur on Tier 1 projects

Moving to Prioritization

Potential Prioritization Factors:

- Complements Preferred Community Develop Scenario
- Safety benefit (on street with documented Vision Zerotype crashes)
- Project within/serves Brentwood-Darlington
- Improves access to parks, schools, and other key destinations
- Community support
- Cost/Feasibility
- Others?










Timeline
