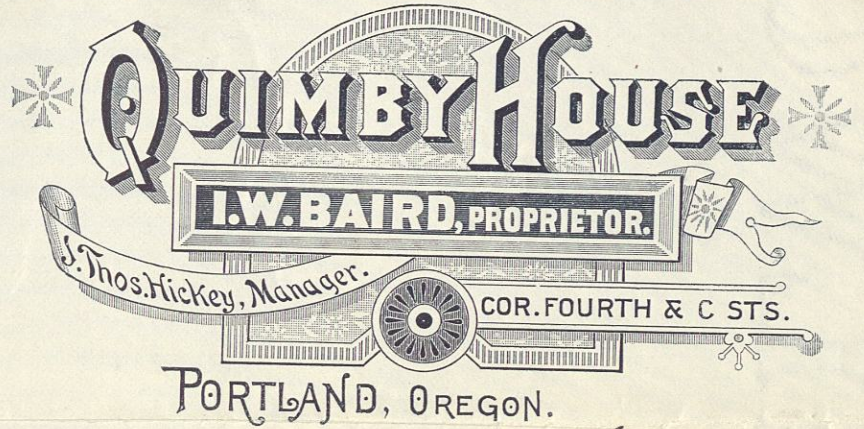

Dear sir:

I have a collection of models
maps and charts - represent-
ing the Human anatomy in
health and disease: similar
to the anatomical museums
in New-York City: Chicago: St-
Paul: Philadelphia: Dr Jordans
of San-francisco: etc - An in-
stitution of this kind is found
in near every large city, and
are not required to pay a
license: I have paid \$20 here
already: I wish to remain per-

knowledge may be promoted;
