

KEY:

SW Capitol Hwy and SW Sunset Red BAT lane paint makes it confusing for westbound cars that want to turn right onto Sunset.



- Cars are starting to use Chetlenham to Dewitt to detour from the Sunset intersection because of the confusion caused by the red paint (shown as above) at the Capitol Hwy & Sunset intersection.
- SW Dewitt and SW Pendleton are two streets that we have asked PBOT to add to their list of streets to collect preconstruction baseline traffic counts. We have not received confirmation this has happened.
 - After five weeks of the Capitol Hwy Rose Lane installation, cars are already taking detours to avoid the SW Capitol Hwy and Sunset intersection.
- Request Commissioner Hardesty to make this field trip to Hillsdale during evening peak hour to experience firsthand how the Capitol Hwy Rose Lane Project is affecting the southside of Capitol businesses. From SW Barbur Blvd, turn onto SW Capitol Hwy. Once in Hillsdale turn left into the southside parking lot. Then exit.

Subject: Bus-Only Lane on Beaverton Hillsdale Highway

Hello,

Yesterday I experienced driving on Beaverton-Hillsdale Highway with the new Bus-Only lanes. This project reduced available lanes by half--which resulted in very long lines of traffic in both directions and a much longer commute. Who benefits from this??

I am writing to express my extreme irritation and unhappiness with this new development, especially in light of the fact that there are no bus stops from Barbur Boulevard all the way up to Terwilliger Boulevard—none! What a waste of available resources! I believe reserving half the BHH lanes solely for buses and bus riders is unfair and unproductive. Our tax dollars should be spent for the benefit of all users of the roads, and not primarily for TriMet users (of which I am one). When the Hillsdale Business Association meets with the City Council in October, please urge them to re-think this decision and remove the Bus-Only designations.

Chris Braidwood-Reid's testimony at City Council Meeting

Good Morning - My name is Chris Braidwood-Reid. I manage commercial property in Hillsdale.

I come to you today to follow-up on the Capitol Hwy Rose Lane Project, which was installed five weeks ago.

As we feared, the project has left the community confused and frustrated. Aftermath issues we initially expressed are already coming true:

Eastbound -

- One business on the southside reports a 9% loss of revenue from the prior month due to loss of evening commuting customers.
- Several businesses are reporting an increase in their morning commute, oftentimes waiting thru
 three cycles of a traffic signal to get into Hillsdale, causing employees to be late.
- Buses are also caught in this backlog getting to their Hillsdale BAT lane...enough to cause riders
 requesting to get off the bus prior to the stop just so that they are not late to work.
 Any time saved by utilizing the BAT lane is lost is in the time getting INTO Hillsdale...
 this will only increase when traffic counts increase.
- Any carbon emissions saved by a bus using the BAT lane is also lost in the backlog of traffic getting INTO Hillsdale.
- There's increased difficulty turning into the southside parking lot having to cross the bus lane while trying to avoid bikers and pedestrians.
 Drivers feel this is a dangerous experience.
- The southside parking lot is a disaster at times due to the difficulty exiting the lot to cross-over or merge into the consolidated eastbound lane of cars that has limited access points.
- AND Reports of Customers detouring around Hillsdale entirely because the lanes are so confusing.

ALL of these issues are caused by a plan, intended to save 1-2 minutes during morning peak transit times, based on Pre-covid traffic counts.

Traffic counts that we do NOT currently have nor can we predict WHEN or IF we will.

Westbound -

- Evening peak hour complaints continue to increase about the backup from Barbur Blvd turning onto Capitol Hwy
- Capitol Hwy and Sunset intersection is extremely confusing for those cars wanting to turn right onto Sunset due to the red paint. A bus in the lane makes it even MORE confusing.
 Cars that want to turn right onto Sunset have begun detouring from Capitol Hwy to Dewitt to bypass the intersection

WHY have a lane that is used perhaps 1-2% of a day, empty the rest, causing all these issues?

In August, I invited City Commissioners to take a field trip to Hillsdale before the Project was installed. Today I invite Commissioner Hardesty to take that same trip, entering and exiting the southside parking lot. I'm happy to meet and be a guide if that would be helpful. We will be emailing you this week for a TIME CERTAIN for your visit and for a PBOT assessment of the impact of this project.

TriMet is currently proposing to discontinue 12 bus lines in SW Portland by Oct 31st. Those proposals COMBINED with PBOT's insistence to install a Rose Lane project in Hillsdale where more harm is caused than good, makes no sense!

Currently traffic counts are still low, and with the initial negative feedback we are receiving due to the project, I shudder to think about how much it will escalate with increased traffic counts.

With the continuation of covid and the practice of hybrid work environments, the likelihood of having pre-covid traffic counts are uncertain at best, which was the initial reason for the Hillsdale Project.

Please STOP the negative impact on Hillsdale businesses and neighborhoods and **REMOVE** the Capitol Hwy Rose Lane Project.
