RE: Testimony on Wednesday, October 26, 2022, 2:00 PM Agenda Items 899, 900, 901, 902, and 903 (Homelessness Response Agenda Items)

Dear City Council,

First and foremost I want to thank Mayor Ted Wheeler for starting to take serious action on the homelessness and related public safety / public health crisis we are seeing play out on the streets of Portland. This proposed action, unfortunately, comes years too late and should have been taken earlier on in your administration. Citizens have had enough of the homelessness crisis and related public safety and public health issues caused by homelessness. The reality is not everyone living outside is down on their luck in fact according to statements by city employees reported in the media each time a sweep occurs social workers offer housing and a majority of those offered shelter and services refuse those services. This is called service resistance and it is a real thing and it's typically driven by substance abuse and mental health issues. We have homeless people on a routine basis engaging in acts of violence including rape and murder as has been reported by the media. We have homeless people defecating in broad daylight when they have access to public restrooms at hundreds of locations throughout the city.
