This is to advise the City of Portland, Oregon, that I hereby accept the terms and provisions of Ordinance No. 136137, passed by the Council March 7, 1973, amending Contract No. 13590 with Stevens, Thompson & Runyan, Inc., to delete the 4% Engineer's fee for the excess cost of professional liability insurance, and enlarging the services to be performed under Contract No. 13590 to include professional consulting engineering services for the design, preparation of plans and specifications for removing the deteriorating lightweight aggregate block exterior walls from the four digesters at the Columbia Boulevard Sewage Treatment Plant and replacing them with a frost-free brick, for an additional sum not to exceed \$5,000, authorizing the drawing and delivery of warrants, and declaring an emergency, and in consideration of the benefits to be received thereunder by me I hereby agree to abide by and perform each and all of the terms and provisions thereof applicable to me.

ORDINANCE NO. 136137

An Ordinance amending Contract No. 13590 with Stevens, Thompson & Runyan, Inc., to delete the 4% Engineer's fee for the excess cost of professional liability insurance, and enlarging the services to be performed under Contract No. 13590 to include professional consulting engineering services for the design, preparation of plans and specifications for removing the deteriorating lightweight aggregate block exterior walls from the four digesters at the Columbia Boulevard Sewage Treatment Plant and replacing them with a frost-free brick, for an additional sum not to exceed \$5,000, authorizing the drawing and delivery of warrants, and declaring an emergency.

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds that, pursuant to Ordinance No. 135597, passed by the Council November 15, 1972, and entitled: "An ordinance authorizing a contract with Stevens, Thompson & Runyan, Inc., professional consulting engineers, for design of a pollution control laboratory at the Columbia Boulevard Sewage Treatment Plant, for a sum not to exceed \$15,000 plus an amount not to exceed 4% of the Engineer's fee for the excess cost of professional liability insurance, authorizing the drawing and delivery of a warrant, and declaring an emergency," the City entered into Contract No. 13590 on the 19th day of December, 1972, with Stevens, Thompson & Runyan, Inc. for professional consulting engineering services; the Council further finds that Stevens, Thompson & Runyan, Inc., has requested the deletion of the requirement for 4% of the Engineer's fee for the excess cost of professional liability insurance and it is in the best interest of the City that Contract No. 13590 be amended to delete the 4% of the Engineer's fee for the excess cost of professional liability insurance; the Council further finds that the lightweight block exterior wall on the four sludge digesters at the Columbia Boulevard Sewage Treatment Plant is in need of repair and should be removed and replaced with frost-free brick, and it is in the best interest of the City that Contract No. 13590 be amended to provide for the design, preparation of plans and specification for the replacement of the four digester exterior walls with frost-free brick and to allow payment for said additional services; now, therefore, Contract No. 13590 with Stevens, Thompson & Runyan, Inc., shall have the 4% Engineer's fee for the excess cost of professional liability insurance deleted, and shall require Stevens, Thompson & Runyan, Inc. to provide professional consulting services for the design, plans and specifications for replacing the lightweight aggregate block exterior walls of the four digesters with frost-free brick for an increased cost not to exceed \$5,000, all to be made an integral part of said contract, all other terms and conditions of said contract to remain in full force and effect.

Section 2. This ordinance shall become an effective amendment to Contract No. 13590 described in Section 1 hereof upon acceptance of




Section 3. Inasmuch as this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, peace and safety of the City of Portland in this: In order that the work of the design, plans and specifications, and construction of the project in Section 1 hereof may be commenced without delay, this ordinance shall be effective immediately upon its passage; therefore an emergency hereby is declared to exist and the ordinance shall be in force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.
