

ORDINANCE NO. 145308

An Ordinance authorizing the Exposition-Recreation Commission, effective 12:01 A.M., March 11, 1978, to participate in the City's Self-Insurance Program, through the Loss Reserve Fund, upon maintaining through a private insurance carrier excess liability coverage in the sum of \$5,000,000, and authorizing the Exposition-Recreation Commission to allow its existing private liability insurance coverage to expire, and declaring an emergency.

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

1. On April 27, 1977, the Council passed Ordinance No. 143519 recognizing the City's obligation and duty to defend, save harmless and indemnify the Commission, its individual Commissioners, and its officers, employees and agents against all claims and demands, groundless or otherwise, arising out of alleged acts or omissions occurring in the performance of duty, in the same manner as the City has the obligation and duty to and shall, defend, save harmless and indemnify individual members of the Council and other officers, employees and agents of the City, under the same circumstances.
2. By Ordinance No. 143519, the Council authorized the Commission to participate in the City's Self-Insurance Program, through the City's Loss Reserve Fund, upon the condition that the ERC shall keep and maintain with a private insurance carrier a \$5,000,000 excess liability policy over the Self-Insurance Program.
3. On March 7, 1978, the Commission passed Resolution No. 196, allowing its existing comprehensive liability insurance coverage to expire at midnight on March 10, 1978, and effective at 12:01 A.M. on March 11, 1978, to participate in the City's Self-Insurance Program and effective at that time and date to provide comprehensive liability insurance coverage with a private insurance carrier in excess of the City's Self-Insurance Program, in the amount of \$5,000,000.



NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:


- a. That the Exposition-Recreation Commission is hereby authorized to allow its existing comprehensive liability insurance coverage to expire at midnight on March 10, 1978 and, effective at 12:01 A.M. on March 11, 1978, to participate in the City's Self-Insurance Program, and effective at that time and date shall provide evidence of comprehensive liability insurance coverage with a private insurance carrier with limits of \$5,000,000 in excess of the City's Self-Insurance Program.

Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists because a delay in authorizing the Exposition-Recreation Commission to participate in the City's Self-Insurance Program through the Loss Reserve Fund on the conditions stated will result in additional expense; therefore, this ordinance shall be in force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.
