
Code Section	N1101.1(1), N1104.7
Requires	Slab edge insulation
Code Modification or Alternate Requested	Utilize continuous above-slab floor insulation in lieu of slab-edge insulation.
Proposed Design	We propose continuous insulation above the slab-on-grade instead of on the edge per the attached detail. Six inches of EPS insulation (approx. R-24) is proposed over the concrete slab. The finish floor would be installed on two layers of 19/32" plywood above the insulation.
Reason for alternative	This project is designed to be super-insulation and airtight. Slab edge insulation per the code requirement is not sufficient to meet the Passive House level of insulation. By insulating above the slab, the finished floor is protected by a continuous layer of insulation because it connects to the wall insulation. This design solution provides superior energy conservation to what the code requires.

APPEAL DECISION

Use of continuous above-slab floor insulation in lieu of slab-edge insulation: Granted as proposed.

The Administrative Appeal Board finds that the information submitted by the appellant demonstrates that the approved modifications or alternate methods are consistent with the intent of the code; do not lessen health, safety, accessibility, life, fire safety or structural requirements; and that special conditions unique to this project make strict application of those code sections impractical.
