Emergency Ordinance

*Authorize grant agreement with Linnton Community Center for operational costs associated with after-school youth programs

Passed

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- The Linnton Community Center (LCC) is a nonprofit corporation that supports the community through its community food bank, volunteer services, community connections, and preschool and childcare programs. LCC has experienced financial difficulties due to the increasing needs of the Linnton community and the lack of sustained funding.
- 2. There are no City of Portland recreational facilities located in the Linnton neighborhood.
- 3. There is a need for on-going funding from the City to support LCC's after-school recreational and enrichment programs for youth.
- 4. LCC is in need of support for its facilities and programs. The purpose of this grant is to support LCC's general operations, specifically for its Recreational and Enrichment Programs for Youth during out-of-school hours.
- 5. LCC will report to Portland Parks & Recreation (PP&R) on how the LCC uses the grant funds, along with how many youth are served by the programs supported by this grant. PP&R and LCC have operated under a series of similar agreements since 2010.
- 6. LCC and PP&R desire to execute a new grant agreement for Fiscal Years 2022-23 and 2023-24. Under this new agreement, PP&R will continue to provide financial support LCC to operate and deliver its after school youth programs.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

A. The Director of the Bureau of Parks & Recreation is authorized to execute a grant agreement for the Recreational and Enrichment Programs for Youth with the Linnton Community Center in the Fiscal Years 2022-23 and 2023-24 in an amount not to exceed \$92,014, in a
