# Who does what?



## City Elections Office

The Auditor's role in overseeing candidate-related processes in City of Portland elections:

- Receives and process candidate information when filing to run for office.
- Provides candidate training.
- Enforces City campaign finance regulations.
- Refers qualified candidates to the Multnomah County Elections Division for inclusion in the next election.
- Certifies election results through City Council action as reported and referred by the Multnomah County Elections Division.
- Future: Periodic voter education campaigns.

# Elections Division

Elections Division conducts all local, city, county, state, and federal elections for the citizens of all political districts within Multnomah County:

- Registers voters.
- Maintains voter registration and election management database.
- · Maintains address and district data.
- Checks signatures on candidate and initiative petitions.
- Accepts candidate and measure filings.

# Elections Division's work cont.



- Produces voters' pamphlets.
- Prepares, issues, and mails ballots.
- Manages the main office, a satellite voting center, and 30 other drop-site locations.
- Accepts and process returned ballots.
- Counts ballots and release results.
- Voter education, outreach, and assistance to voters with disabilities and voters who speak languages other than English.


