Subject: Round 1 Workshops Polling Results Summary

This memo is a summary of the instant polling results from the first round of seven Portland Plan workshops held in November and December 2009. Attached are charts showing the combined results of the interactive polling from all of the workshops.

- Over 900 people signed in at the workshops.
- West Portlanders had a large turnout that exceeded their share of the population. Whereas, East Portlanders were significantly underrepresented, although this result could be attributed to confusion about the boundaries of the East Portland district.
- Participants tended to be more affluent and not as ethnically or racially diverse as Portland as a whole. The smaller community group meetings scheduled in January will be the means to increase participation in underrepresented communities.
- 94+% of the evaluations indicated that the workshop was useful event that provided a meaningful opportunity to voice their opinions and was informative about the issues.
- 31% of the participants did not have a high level of knowledge or involvement in Portland issues, which indicates the workshops attracted some new "voices" to the discussion.
- In general, the responses to the polling questions were consistent between the seven workshops.
- Sustainability and the Natural Environment was consistently rated as most important issue facing Portland. Prosperity, Business Success & Equity, Education & Skill Development, and Human Health, Food & Public Safety all consistently appeared in the top three rankings. Only the East Portland workshop rated Quality of Life & Civic Engagement in the top three.
- Walkability was a strong theme in the responses, whether it involved improving neighborhood business districts, deciding where to live, or spending priorities for Portland's limited transportation funds.
- Access to natural areas, trails and greenways also enjoyed strong support across the workshops.
- The most variation in responses came with the transportation questions. Transit improvements were the overall favorite, but East Portland tended to favor sidewalks and Northeast favored bicycle facilities. Maintaining and repairing existing streets was consistently ranked in the top three choices at all of the workshops.
