Claim for damages against the City of Portland Summary of Claim E10368 Sunnyside South Sewer Project 8/31/2023 Lydia Anderson-Dana and James Kite

Damages related to E10368 Sunnyside South Sewer Project- additional information

On July 19, 2023, I received an email from Debbie Caselton with the City of Portland Bureau of Environmental Services around 3PM, informing me: "Our contractor has damaged your water line and they have a temporary solution, but wanted to know if you are going to be home this afternoon so you can shut your water off so they can get a temporary connection for you. They are working to figure out a permanent solution and what that looks like." Exhibit 1 (emails with the City) at 1. The contractor damages the water line between our home and the water meter, in our driveway. My husband, James Kite, was able to go home that afternoon and work with the contractors to attach a hose to the undamaged part of our water line (located in our driveway) so that we would have water restored to our home. There was no flooding or other water damage to our property, to my knowledge.

We had been planning on replacing our sewer line but not our water line in the near future, as the water line worked fine. We immediately contacted our sewer contractor, Steve McBee, who came out and gave us the name of a plumbing contractor who could install a permanent fix. *See* Exhibit 1; *see also* Exhibits 2–4 (emails, invoices, and bills from Lovett Inc.). Lovett gave us an estimate for \$6,886.55 to install a new waterline. Exhibits 2a, 2b. On July 25, 2023, I confirmed with Ms. Caselton that we should go ahead and have a contractor fix the waterline permanently, rather than wait for the city. Exhibit 1 at 3.

Lovett Inc. installed a new waterline on August 1, 2023, at which time they informed us we might need to get grounding rods installed as well. On August 10, 2023, the city inspector came to our house and approved the water line, but informed us (as Lovett suspected) that we would need to get grounding rods put in, given that our old water line was metal and the new one was plastic. We contacted an electrician, Canyon Ridge Electric, that same day, who estimated that it would cost around \$1150 to install the ground rods and get permits. Exhibit 5 at 3. Canyon Ridge installed the grounding rods on August 18, 2023. *See* Exhibit 5.

The city inspector approved the grounding rods on August 25, 2023. Exhibit 7. We received final invoices for \$6886.55 from Lovett on August 18, 2023 and \$1150 from Canyon Ridge on August 31, 2023, and have paid both invoices in full. Exhibits 4, 6.
