An Ordinance granting a revocable permit to the Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company to install an underground cable across the southerly edge of Playground No. 53 B, and declaring an emergency.

The City of Portland does ordain as follows:

Section 1. The Council finds that the Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company has applied for permission to install and maintain an underground cable across the southerly edge of Binsmead Park Playground, otherwise known as Playground No. 53 B; that said cable will not be exposed anywhere in said playground area and that the Bureau of Parks has no objection to said installation; if said cable be properly covered with earth; now, therefore, a revocable permit hereby is granted to the Facific Telephone and Telegraph Company to install and maintain an underground power cable across the southerly edge of Playground No. 53 B, said cable to be located 5 feet from the southerly odge of said playground and across said playground from S.A. 84th Avenue approximately 117 feet to the westerly edge of said playground, subject to the following further terms and conditions:

- (a) That said cable be buried at all points in said playground with a minimum cover of 18 inches of earth.
- (b) That this permit is revocable at the pleasure of the Council subject to 90 days' notice in writing, and no expenditure of money hereunder nor lapse of time nor other act or thing shall operate as an estoppel against the City of Portland or be held to give the grantee any vested or other right, and, if revoked, the grantee shall immediately discontinue the use of the said area for the purposes herein granted and remove all installations therefrom.
- (c) The grantee shall hold the City of Fortland, its officers, agents and employes free and harmless from any claim or claims for damage to person or property which may be occasioned by the installation, maintenance, existence or removal of said cable.
- (d) The grantee shall first furnish a policy or certificate of insurance affording protection against claims arising out of the installation of said cable in the amounts of \$50,000 for bodily

injury to one person, \$100,000 for bodily injuries arising from one accident and \$10,000 for property damage. Said policy shall be endorsed to include the City of Fortland, its officers, agents and employes as additional assureds, without prejudice to coverage otherwise existing therein, and shall further provide that said policy shall not be cancelled without first giving ten days written notice to the Auditor of the City of Fortland. (e) This ordinance shall not become effective until the grantee shall have filed with the City Auditor a document satisfactory to the City Attorney accepting the terms and conditions thereof.

Section 2. Inasmuch as this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, peace and safety of the City of Fortland in this: In order that there may be no unnecessary delay in the use of the area for the purpose desired; therefore an emergency hereby is declared to exist and this ordinance shall be in force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.







## ORDINANCE NO. 97131

An Ordinance repealing Ordinance No. 96616 entitled: "An Ordinance granting a revocable permit to the Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company to install an underground cable across the southerly edge of Playground No. 53 B, and declaring an emergency", passed by the Council June 26, 1952.

The City of Portland does ordain as follows:

Section 1. The Council finds that The racific Telephone and Telegraph Company was granted a revocable permit to install an underground cable across playground area by Ordinance No. 96616, passed by the Council June 26, 1952; that said company has requested a cancellation of said permit since it has not been used, and plans have been changed so that it will not be necessary; now, therefore, Ordinance No. 96616, entitled: "An Ordinance granting a revocable permit to the racific Telephone and Telegraph Company to install an underground cable across the southerly edge of Flayground No. 53 B, and declaring an emergency", passed by the Council June 26, 1952, be and the same hereby is repealed.

## ORDINANCE NO. 97352

An Ordinance granting a revocable permit to The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company to install an overhead cable crossing along the south line of Playground 53B at Binsmead School, and declaring an emergency.

The City of Portland does ordain as follows:

Section 1. The Council finds that The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company has applied for permission to install and maintain an overhead cable across the southerly edge of Binsmead Park Playground, otherwise known as Playground No. 53B; that said cable will be a minimum of 19 feet above the ground, and that the Bureau of Parks has no objection to said installation; now, therefore, a revocable permit hereby is granted to The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company to install and maintain an overhead cable across the southerly edge of Playground No. 53B, said location being more particularly shown on the attached sketch marked Exhibit A and hereby made a part of this ordinance, subject to the following further terms and conditions:

- (a) That said cable shall be a minimum distance of 19 feet above the ground.
- (b) That this permit is revocable at the discretion of the Council subject to 90 days' notice in writing, and no expenditure of money hereunder nor lapse of time nor other act or thing shall operate as an estoppel against the City of Portland or be held to give the grantee any vested or other right, and, if revoked, the grantee shall immediately discontinue the use of the said area for the purposes herein granted and remove all installations therefrom.
- (c) The grantee shall hold the City of Portland, its officers, agents and employes free and harmless from any claim or claims for damage to person or property which may be occasioned by the installation, maintenance, existence or removal of said cable.
- (d) This ordinance shall not become effective until the grantee has filed with the City Auditor a document approved as to form by the City Attorney accepting the terms and conditions thereof.

Section 2. Inasmuch as this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, peace and safety of the City of Portland in this: in order that there may be no unnecessary delay in the use of the area for the purpose desired; therefore, an emergency hereby is declared to exist and this ordinance shall be in force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.

Clackamas Portland, Oregon Dear Mr. Edwards: A problem has arisen in connection with the use of the ball field on the northeast corner of the Binnsmead school grounds. You will recall that before the school was built the Park Bureau sold a strip of park to the district so that the school could be located farther west and provide a right-of-way for S.E. 87th Avenue on the east side of the school. It was agreed at that time that the irrigation and backstops would be built and the field would be used and maintained by the Park Bureau during non-school periods. The increase in the program of Little League baseball was put a great deal of pressure on us for field use, and we have until recently been scheduling both fields at Binnsmead. Because of the new homes that have been built across the street from the field and the resultant broken windows, we have discontinued our use of the northeast diamond. However, the neighborhood children and youths are using the field and still endangering the windows across the street. A different type backstop would eliminate the difficulty. We are using a come type in areas where space is restricted, and it has solved all our foulball problems back of the home plate and for a considerable angle to right and left. Attached is a location plan of the northeast corner of the school grounds, which indicates the present backstop and the proposed change. A fence to stop overthrows to first base is also indicated. Also enclosed is a blueprint of the "Barrel Backstop" that we have found successful. Would the school district consider replacing this backstop and installing a wing fence? The probable cost, based on our most recent contract, is: backstop \$1400, wing fence \$325.
