Ordinance No. 45258

An Ordinance amending Article I. of Ordinance No. 32929, an ordinance on public safety and general welfare, by adding thereto a section to be numbered Section 43, and declaring an emergency.

The City of Portland does ordain as follows:

Section 1. That Article I. of Ordinance No. 32929 entitled, "An Ordinance on public safety and general welfare, and declaring an emergency," passed by the Council June 6, 1917, be and the same is hereby amended by adding thereto a section to be numbered Section 43, reading as follows:

Section 43. Park Block Designated as Block 54, City of Portland, bounded by Main, Third, Madison and Fourth Streets, and Park Block designated as Block D, Couch's Addition to the City of Portland, bounded by Everett, Eighth, Davis and Park Streets, are hereby specifically reserved for the use of women and children and their escorts. It shall be unlawful for any man not accompanied by a woman or child to use said park blocks and it shall be unlawful for any such person to refuse a request to vacate said park blocks upon the command of any park officer or officer of the Bureau of Police. Any person violating any of the provisions of this particular section shall, upon conviction thereof in the Municipal Court be fined not more than Fifty Dollars.

Section 2. Inasmuch as this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, peace and safety of the City of Portland in this: That it is necessary to have certain portions of the downtown blocks in the City of Portland reserved to the exclusive use of women and children and their escorts and no provision is now incorporated in the ordinance providing for this reservation, therefore an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this ordinance shall be in force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.
