Whereas, Gerardo Calderón, who was the musical director of the group Grupo Condor; co-founder of Nuestro Canto with Nelda Reyes, a group dedicated to the preservation of Mexican and Oregonian art and culture through arts education; and a member of Cosecha Mestiza and former Andanzas Lo Nuestro and Caña Son; and

Whereas, as a teaching artist for 30 years, Gerardo Calderón has taught students in pre-K, kinder, elementary, middle, and high schools pre-Columbian music, stories, and instrument-making; and





