

## **Third Quarter Community Complaints Data**


## Preliminary Count of Community Complaints Q3 2017 - Q3 2018



IPR and Internal Affairs received 102 community complaints during July, August, and September of 2018. This was 15 fewer than last quarter but only 1 more complaint than the third quarter of 2017.

Eighty-eight of the complaints were received by IPR and fourteen came through Internal Affairs. Of the IPR complaints, three were opened by IPR as independent investigations, nine were


referred to Internal Affairs and intake is ongoing for eight complaints. Forty-two complaints were administratively closed, most commonly because no misconduct was identified. Twenty-three complaints were referred to officers' supervisors for investigation and three were referred to a precinct commander for follow-up. No complaints entered mediation during this quarter.





Though many cases are still in progress and additional allegations will likely be added, community complaints made in the third quarter of 2018 contained 194 allegations.





Findings were completed for 91 allegations (from 30 cases) in the third quarter of 2018. Sixteen percent (15) of those allegations were sustained.

Cases that are referred to supervisors for investigation also receive findings. Since the implementation of supervisory investigations in July, findings were completed for 49 allegations from 28 cases sent for supervisory investigation. All of these allegations dealt with potential conduct, courtesy or procedure violations.

## **Findings in Supervisory Investigations**



Members who have already received a substantiated finding within the last year regarding the same or similar type of misconduct are no longer eligible for supervisory investigations and subsequent complaints will be assigned as administrative investigations.
