

Your prompt consideration in this matter will be greatly appreciated.

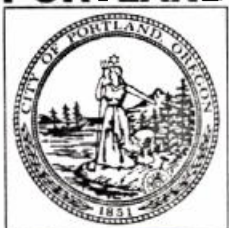

Dear Commissioner Jordan:

On Friday, January 31, 1975, a meeting was held with School District #1 representatives to discuss the possibility of having the school district fund the Reading Tree Program during the summer of 1975. The school district representatives were supportive of the program, but indicated some problems in funding the program. First, the school district area offices are responsible for planning summer programs and only those students residing within a particular school area are eligible to participate in programs for that area. Because of the location of the Reading Tree Program in Irving Park, the students participating in the program are from all three school districts. This presents some problems in identifying students from each of the school districts. Second, federal school funds have restrictions which prohibit the use of federal funds for the Reading Tree Program.

For the reasons explained above, I am forwarding a copy of the project description for the Reading Tree Project and request that it be forwarded to Commissioner Schwab for possible inclusion in the Park Bureau's budget request to the City for fiscal year 1975-76. The amount of funds requested is \$4,000 for salaries, books, supplies, etc.

Please contact me if further comment is necessary.


