






Bureau of Emergency Communications Budget




Bureau of Emergency Communications Operational Overtime







Portland Police Bureau Budget




Portland Police Bureau Overtime






PF&R: High-priority (code 3) Fire 12-Month Moving Average




- 701 Sworn (added 23 fire fighters over past two years to reduce overtime, converting 6 limited term FF)

Portland Fire & Rescue Overtime Reduction






Portland Bureau of Emergency Management Budget








Community Safety (Portland Street Response)


