### I. Program Updates

#### Strategic Program 3: Clean Energy in Single-Family Home Program

Critical program with different incentive programs for homeowners and renters, to serve 3,100 homes

- Contracting process is moving forward
- Developing program brand
- Kick off-meeting with partners in April

#### **Strategic Program 6: Transportation Decarbonization Program**

E-Bike Access and Incentive Program; expecting it to be very popular based on other jurisdictions

- Request for Proposal process finished
- Working on getting administrator under contract for soft launch in fall

#### **Strategic Program 14: Access to Capital**

- Partnering with Prosper Portland to launch pilot program for office to residential conversion
- Looking to understand embodied carbon and carbon savings
- Opportunity to have partnership with Prosper
- PCEF providing \$6 7 million for pilot from SP14 allocation, broader RFP for other financing products still to come.
- Committee request for follow-up with more information

#### **FY 25-26 City of Portland Budget**

- City Administrator Budget released end of February
- PCEF providing budget presentation to Climate, Land Use and Resilience Committee
- Co-chair notes recent media interest, they have emphasized that resources are largely allocated

#### **2025 Community Grants**

Key program

- Webpage launch forthcoming
- Grant cycles will be open for 60 days, through May
- \$70 Million expected to be distributed

#### **Federal Impacts to Current Grants**

Climate programming and resources uncertain





- Haven't heard of any official terminations of federal funding for grantees for projects PCEF is also funding
- Will have limit for how many applications an organization can submit in a Community Grants cycle to better manage application volume and ensure broader support of organizations

# Evaluation & Reporting Subcomittee

July 2025 - Community grants and non-City led Strategic Programs

- 1. **Review** status of strategic programs, determine programs for targeted review
- 2. **Assess** Community Grant demand, Strategic Program performance, expenditures
- 3. **Develop**recommendations for increased, decreased, or level funding for each program. Consider staff-recommended technical adjustments, and program scope amendments
- 4. **Evaluate** projected available resources through June 2029 and reallocate based on surplus or deficit. Develop draft funding recommendations and adjustments in consultantion with partners.



# Evaluation & Reporting Subcomittee

September 2025 - Cityled Strategic Programs

- 1. **Review** all City-led Strategic Programs
- 2. **Assess** performances, expenditures, and updated technical adjustments.
- 3. **Develop** recommendations for increased, decreased, or level funding
- 4. **Release** draft funding recommendations. Consider staff recommendations and public comments.
- 5. **Synthensize** public comments, revise, and update recommendations



#### **PCEF Committee**

November 2025 - All Programs

- 1. **Review** and act on subcomittee recommendations. Evaluate propsed adjustments, program scope changes, and funding shifts
- 2. **Recommend** amendments to the Climate Investment Plan





#### Discussion

- How many strategic programs to evaluate. Many are in RFP or contracting stages, so staff will report on statuses and what is ready for evaluation.
- Want full Committee to have opportunity for goal/criteria setting, oversight of funding decisions. And information sharing for the public in full Committee meeting setting. Likely need more than 2-3 touchpoints.
- Demonstrate workable process and communicate with Council committees. City Council is the ultimate decision-maker.
