 - Central City Design Charrette 6/27-6/28, public sessions & reception
- b. Future Opportunities:
 - Legacy Business Program, Commercial Deconstruction Program, Character Statements, Story Windows, leveraging AHC Collection, walks/talks/programs/events/education
 - 2026 Exhibits: "Culture, Climate, & Carbon" and "Hidden Density"

3. Advocacy for Historic & Cultural Preservation

- a. Recent Legislative Positions: Special Assessment, Design Review, etc.
- b. Preservation Watch List: Opportunities to save/adapt/reuse Cleveland High School,
 Burnside Bridge Towers, PSU Historic Residences (Blackstone Hall & Montgomery Ct.)
- c. Top 3 Advocacy Issues:
 - Streetcar-era Main St. Commercial Centers possible small Commercial Conservation Districts leveraging <u>existing research and mapping</u>
 - Rehab Tax Credit
 - Incentives for "Adaptive Density" (commercial to residential for revitalization of downtown + incentives for increasing density in historic residential neighborhoods with less demo)
