The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. That Section 4.16.040, subsection (b), of the City Code limits the amount of accumulated vacation hours at the end of the first pay period in January to an employee's vacation accrual for the preceding 24-month period and Section 4.16.090 limits the number of hours of compensatory time off for holidays that can be carried over from one calendar year to the next to sixty hours.
