**ORDINANCE No. 162193**

- \* Authorize grants for performances and/or public services that promote the arts, and provide for payment. (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds that:

1. The City of Portland and Multnomah County have established the Metropolitan Arts Commission in order to promote and encourage public awareness of, and interest in, literary, performing and visual arts.
2. The Arts Commission has approved 54 Project Grants totalling \$103,300 to the artists and arts organizations shown in Exhibit A, in the given amounts.

NOW THEREFORE, The Council directs:

- a. The Mayor and Auditor to draw and deliver warrants to each individual and organization shown in Exhibit A, with amounts not to exceed the given amounts; to be charged to the Metropolitan Arts Commission (BUC 37500020/260) Miscellaneous Services.

Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists because a delay in proceeding with the grants may unnecessarily deprive the citizens of Portland and Multnomah County of the services being provided; therefore, the Ordinance shall be in force and effect from and its passage by the Council.
