Summary

Cp states a claim of unlawful discrimination in employment based on his sexual orientation Cp is gav

Cp was hired on May 22, 1996 as a part time cook. The person that hired him was Chef, Daniel McGinnis, he reviewed Cp's resume and realized he had instructed him at the culinary school Chef Daniel believed Cp was gay but that played no part in his hiring Cp, it would appear that he had those thoughts about Cp when he taught him at the culinary school

Cp was hired with the understanding that he was working under a 90 orientation period to determine if Cp was the right employee for them and they were the right employer for him

Two days into his employment he was asked to prepare a dish for the Chef and the Chef did not like the way he prepared the dish. He states he tried to instruct Cp on the way he wanted the food prepared but Cp was reluctant to accept his critique.

The Chef noted Cp working on the line he did not appear to be focused, he felt Cp spent to much time away for the food service line, and he felt Cp had an unprofessional attitude

Cp denies that the Chef's opinion is accurate of him; that the Chef's attitude did not seem hostile until he told him he was bringing his fiancee "Thomas" from Europe so they could get married He states he is a professional cook and there was not reason for him to be terminated

Cp had no comparators or witnesses to support his allegation

I am requesting this case be dismissed because Cp has failed to provide the necessary evidence that would establish a link between his protective class and Resp's decision to terminate his employment. Cp was terminated for lawful reasons.

This case is designated a "C"

I. David Sims, being first duly sworn, do depose and say as follows.

### Legal basis for claim

I was hired as a part-time cook on May 22, 1996 A few days into my employment. I asked my supervisor, Bill, how I was doing and if I could improve on my performance Bill said I was doing fine, but that I might "want to tone it down a little." I didn't understand what he was saying and asked him what he meant. He told me that the owner of the café didn t like gay people and that only a few had worked there for any length of time over the years Bill said that one gay person they got rid of very quickly, and another had been in the closet for a long time. When that person finally came out a few weeks before leaving, the owner's wife was shocked because she had previously liked him very much. I was fired shortly thereafter and was told that I "wasn't quite what Besaw's was looking for "

The following causes me to believe Respondent's treatment constituted illegal discrimination

Bill's comments made it very clear that Besaw's would not tolerate an openly gay worker



- Confirms authority of the City Attorney to file an appeal in <u>Sims v Besaw's Cafe</u>, in which validity of private right of action under City of Portland Civil Rights Ordinance, P C C 23 01 has restricted (Resolution)
- WHEREAS The City Council enacted Portland City Code Section 23 01 in 1991 in order to provide basic civil rights protections to Portland citizens on the basis of sexual orientation and source of income
- WHEREAS PCC 23 01 is modeled directly on the state civil rights law, ORS Chapter 659, and provides the same avenues of both administrative review through the State Bureau of Labor and Industries and review in court
- WHEREAS P C C Chapter 23 01 has provided victims of discrimination on the basis of sexual orientation and source of income was a unique and important source of protection from discrimination
- WHEREAS The private right of action conferred under P C C Chapter 23 01 is a crucial component of the civil rights protections intentionally created by the City Council in 1991 and is available to victims of discrimination on the basis of race, gender, marital status, familial status, disability, national origin, age and other categories
- WHEREAS P C C 23 01's conferral of a private right of action was denied by a Multnomah Circuit Court decision in Sims v Besaw's Cafe
- WHEREAS Resolution of the validity of the private right of action under P C C 23 01 is necessary to private all litigants a clear understanding of the scope and effect of the City's 1991 ordinance
- WHEREAS Council earlier authorized intervention in <u>Sims v Besaw's Cafe</u>, or any comparable lawsuit in which P C C 23 01 is being challenged, and City did intervene in that case, and an appeal is now necessary and appropriate

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City Attorney is authorized to pursue an appeal in <u>Sims v Besaw's Cafe</u> or any comparable case in which the validity of the private right of action under PCC 23 01 is being challenged
