**RESOLUTION No.**

Affirm City's continued collaboration with Multnomah County in establishing coordinated vehicle forfeiture scheme for intoxicated drivers and intent to enact complimentary City code provisions during Fall, 1999. (Resolution)

WHEREAS, the City and the County have been working closely to establish coordinated vehicle forfeiture programs to deal with the growing and deadly problem of intoxicated drivers in the Portland metropolitan region;

WHEREAS, the City's current vehicle forfeiture law has not fully addressed the compelling interest of the City in protecting public health, welfare, and safety,

WHEREAS, in 1998, intoxicated drivers caused over 800 accidents in the City of Portland, hundreds of injuries, and twenty-five deaths,

WHEREAS, traditional criminal sanctions including license suspension, incarceration, fines and mandatory treatment have had only minimal impact on the increasingly severe problem of intoxicated driving,

WHEREAS, Multnomah County and the City of Portland are partnering in a collaborative program to adopt a complimentary forfeiture ordinance and civil enforcement scheme,

WHEREAS, the City is currently finalizing a legally enforceable civil forfeiture ordinance with plans to enact such an ordinance soon after Multnomah County proceeds with its own forfeiture law

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Portland Bureau of Police and City Attorney's Office are requested to refine an ordinance which establishes civil forfeiture provisions, and other enforceable civil remedies aimed at combating the devastating problem of intoxicated driving; said ordinance to be developed as soon as possible in collaboration with the efforts of Multnomah County and the Multnomah County District Attorney's Office.
