Resolution to Designate the Multnomah County/City of Portland Youth Advisory Board

II. BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS:

The Youth Advisory Board was established by the Multnomah Commission on Children and Families in 1996. The mission of the Youth Advisory board is to provide a voice for youth in the decisions and policies of government agencies and community organizations that affect the lives of young people.

The vision of the Youth Advisory Board is to have youth play an active and critical role in the decisions that are made for them every day. Young people will not just be viewed as recipients of services, but active members in the community who take a strong role in the policy making and planning.

The Board is made up entirely of youth who range in age from 14-19. The Board members must be living, working or attending school in Multnomah County.

This Board has already been instrumental to the Bureau of Environmental Services by providing a much needed youth perspective to our Clean River Plan

Having watched this group since its inception, when I was Multnomah County Commissioner, I have been impressed with the work of the Youth Advisory Board and the caliber of volunteers they continuously cull from our schools

The City of Portland does not currently have a group whose sole purpose and dedication is to helping the Council to make decisions that will eventually have an impact on the lives of our youth

The Youth Advisory Board meets on alternate Sundays in City Hall and the meetings are open. Should you wish to bring a matter to the attention of the Youth Advisory Board, arrangements need to be made prior to your attendance at that meeting.


