Mayor Clark proclaimed the month of May as Apprenticeship Month.

Commissioner Bogle presented Life Saving Awards to nine Bureau of Emergency Communications employees.

Commissioner Blumenauer introduced a play "Superdude Fights for Clean Rivers" produced by Deborah Rodney, Environmental Services, to educate school children about how the wastewater system works.

OFFICERS IN ATTENDANCE: Cay Kershner, Clerk of the Council; Ruth Spetter, Senior Deputy City Attorney; and Officer Sheridan Grippen, Sergeant at Arms.

Trudy Jones and Grace Fitzgerald, representing Parkrose Heights Neighborhood Association, presented Commissioner Lindberg a check for \$3,000 to be used by the Parks Bureau for construction of a jogging path at Knott Park.

TIME CERTAIN: 2:00 PM - Consider variances and findings for approval, with conditions, of application for a conditional use requested by the Bureau of Planning to construct a new aquatics facility at Matt Dishman Community Center, 77 NE Knott (Hearing; Findings; Previous Agenda 561)

Discussion: Tom McGuire, Planning staff, reviewed the seven proposed variances. He said variance No. 6 had been withdrawn and asked for Council approval of the remaining six.

Paul Norr, attorney for Howard Loukes and Susan Hartnett, said his clients had no objections to the variances. He said following a series of conversations with City staff, they had been able to work out a mechanism with the Parks Bureau and the Office of Transportation to address any traffic problems that may arise at Matt Dishman.

Charles Jordan, Parks Bureau Director, said it looked like a "win-win" situation had been reached between the Parks Bureau and the neighbors.

Eric Wentland, Eliot Neighborhood Association Land-Use Chair, asked for a continuance to give the neighborhood association a chance to review substantial new information they received only within the last 24 hours.

Jim Figurski, Matt Dishman Project Manager, asked Council to deny Mr. Wentland's request. He said Mr. Wentland had been a party to the negotiations all along the way. He questioned Mr. Wentland's authority to represent the neighborhood association, adding that Eliot Neighborhood Association Chair Michael Matteuchi told him that it took no position at this point and noting that its original position was one of support, with concerns. He added that any new information in the supplemental report

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was brought in to specifically address concerns raised by the neighbors themselves. He urged that no more delays be granted in order to proceed with the project.

Mr. Wentland said the point is he does not represent the whole neighborhood and needs to go back and make sure their concerns have been met.

Commissioner Lindberg asked if a continuance had to be granted in this case since the party requesting it was not the appellant.

Ruth Spetter, Senior Deputy City Attorney, said she believed it did not. She added that it was also up to the applicant to decide if it wished to extend beyond the 120-day time period.

Commissioner Lindberg said the Parks Bureau has spent weeks trying to satisfy the neighbors and he thought it was time to move forward.

Commissioner Bogle moved adoption of the variances and the findings in support of them. Commissioner Kafoury seconded and the motion carried. (Y-4)

Commissioner Bogle moved adoption of the findings for approval of the conditional use. Commissioner Kafoury seconded and the motion carried. (Y-4)
