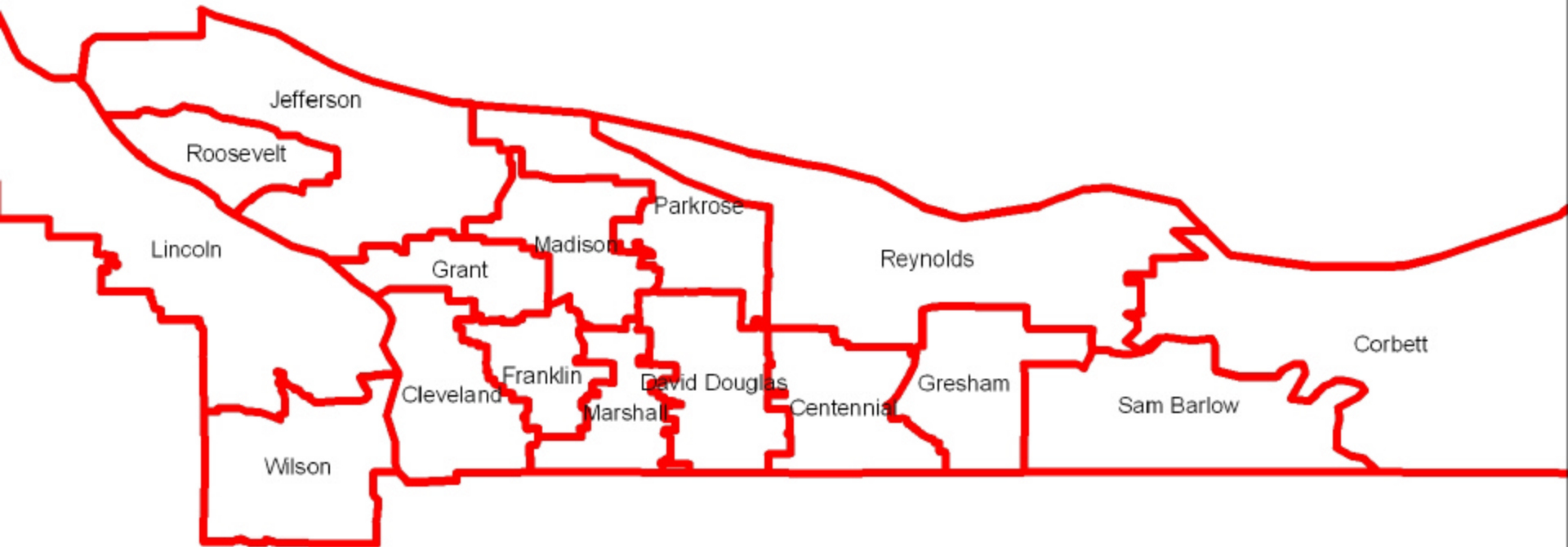


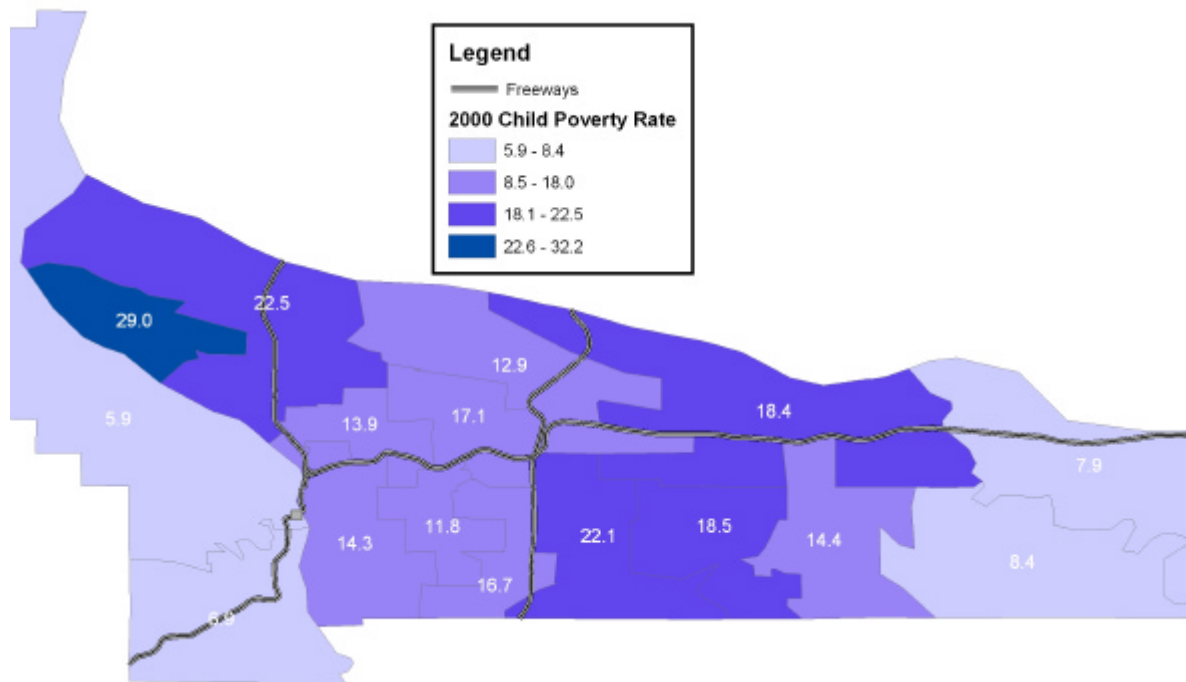
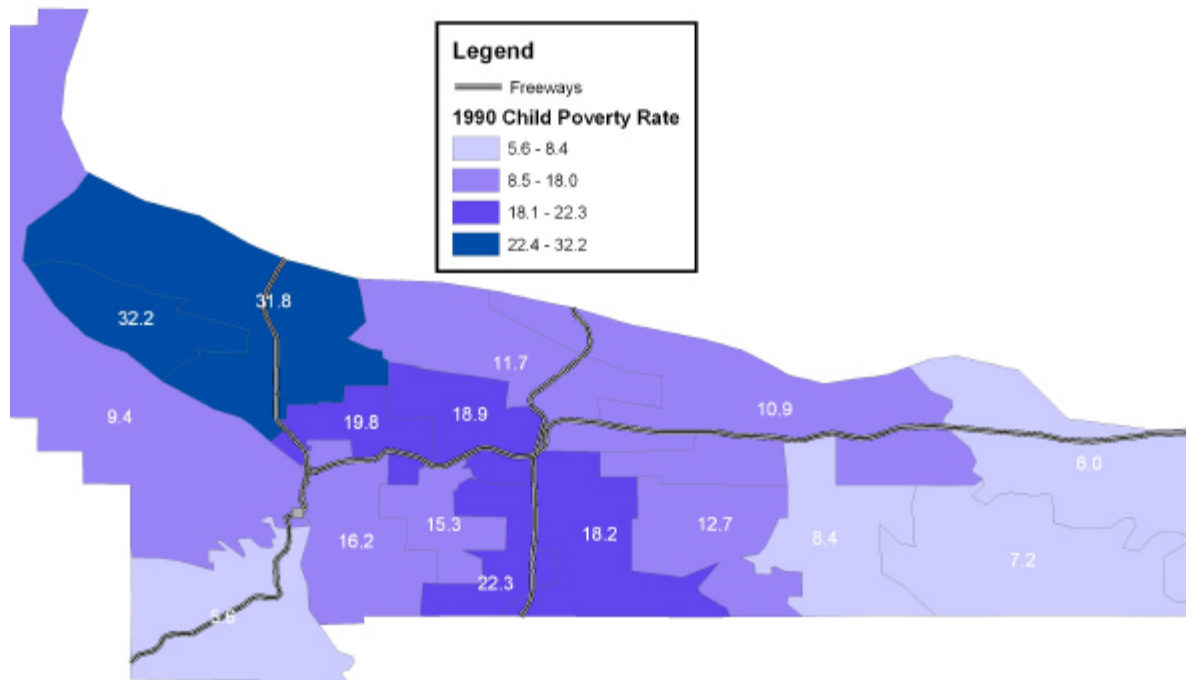
Movement of children and children in poverty in Multnomah County: 1990-2000

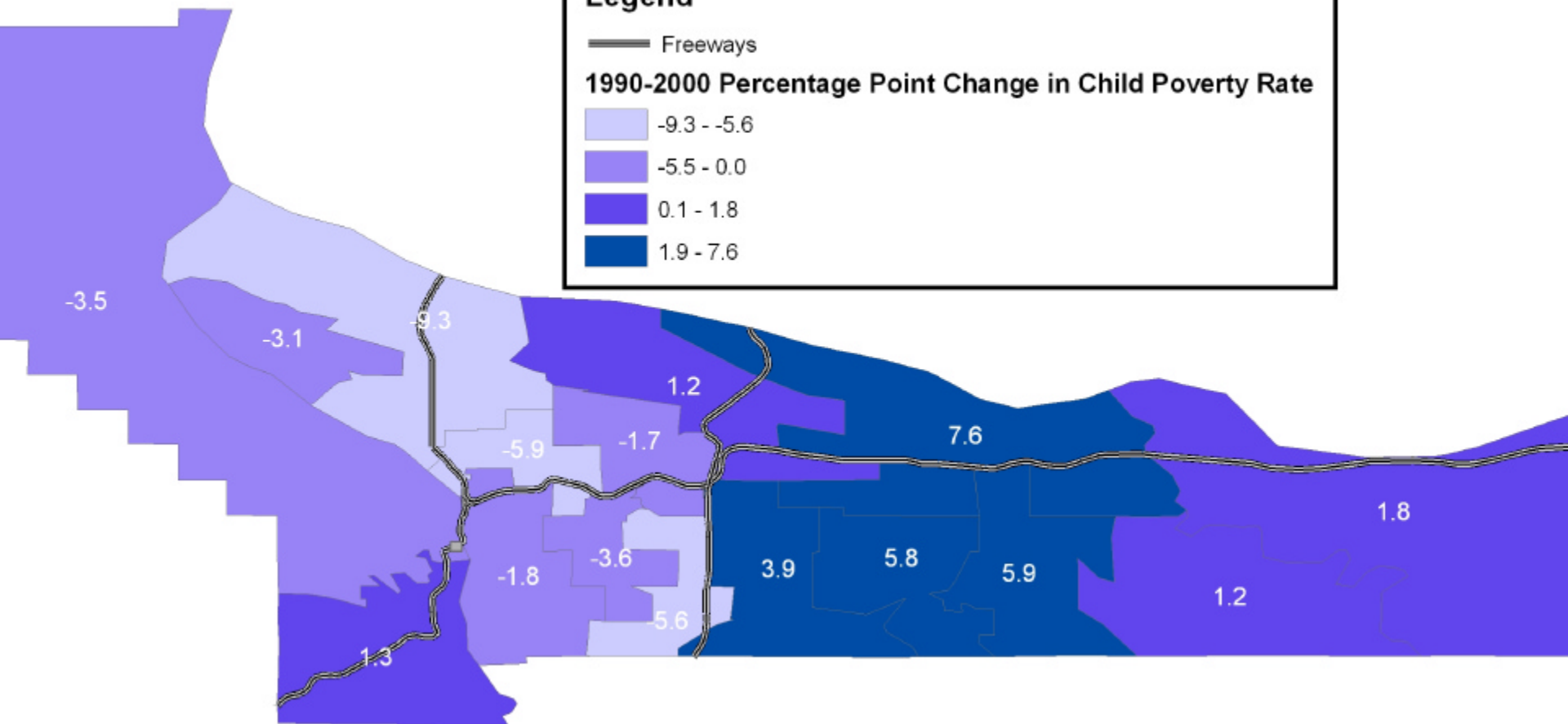

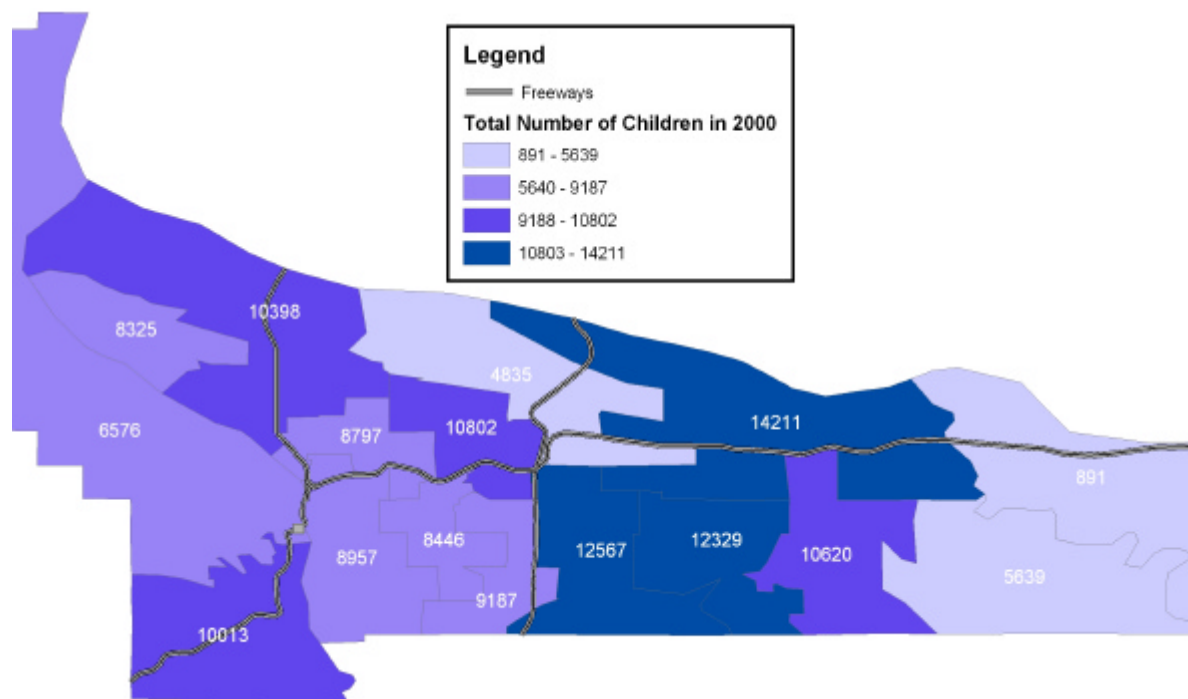
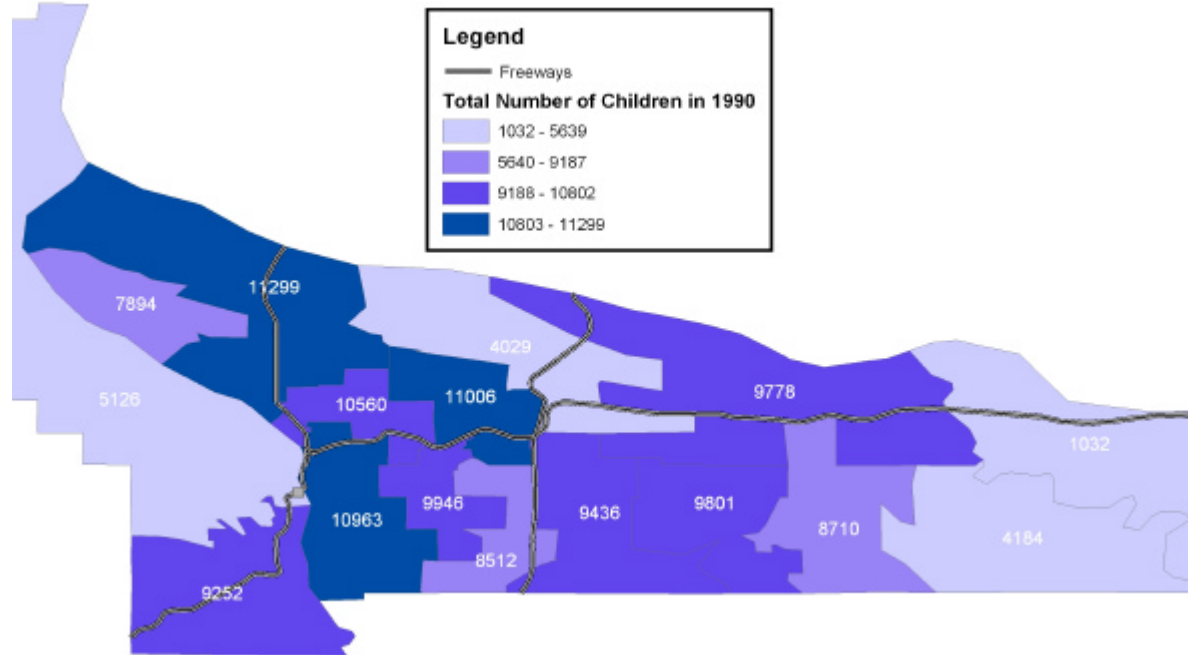

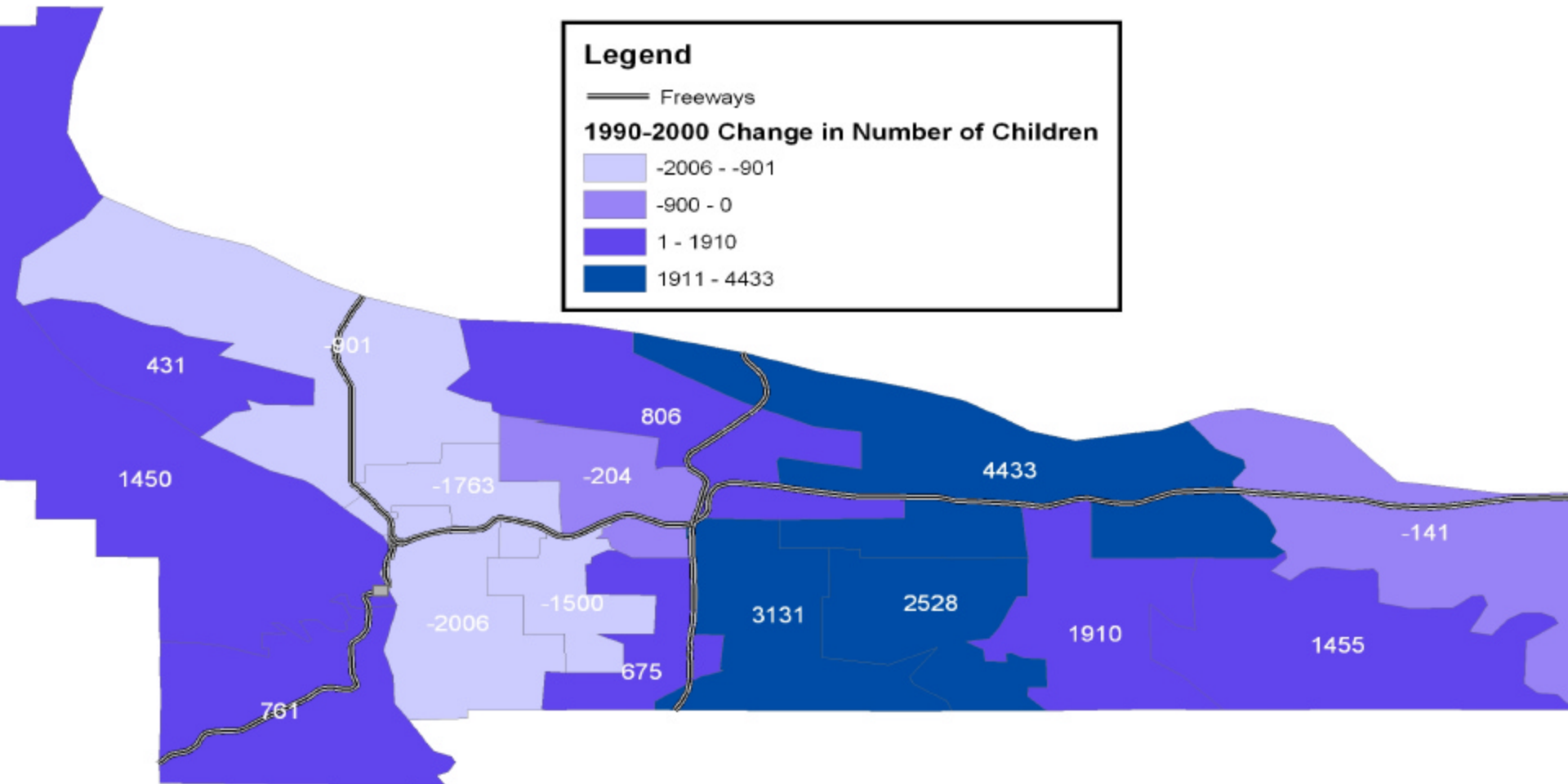

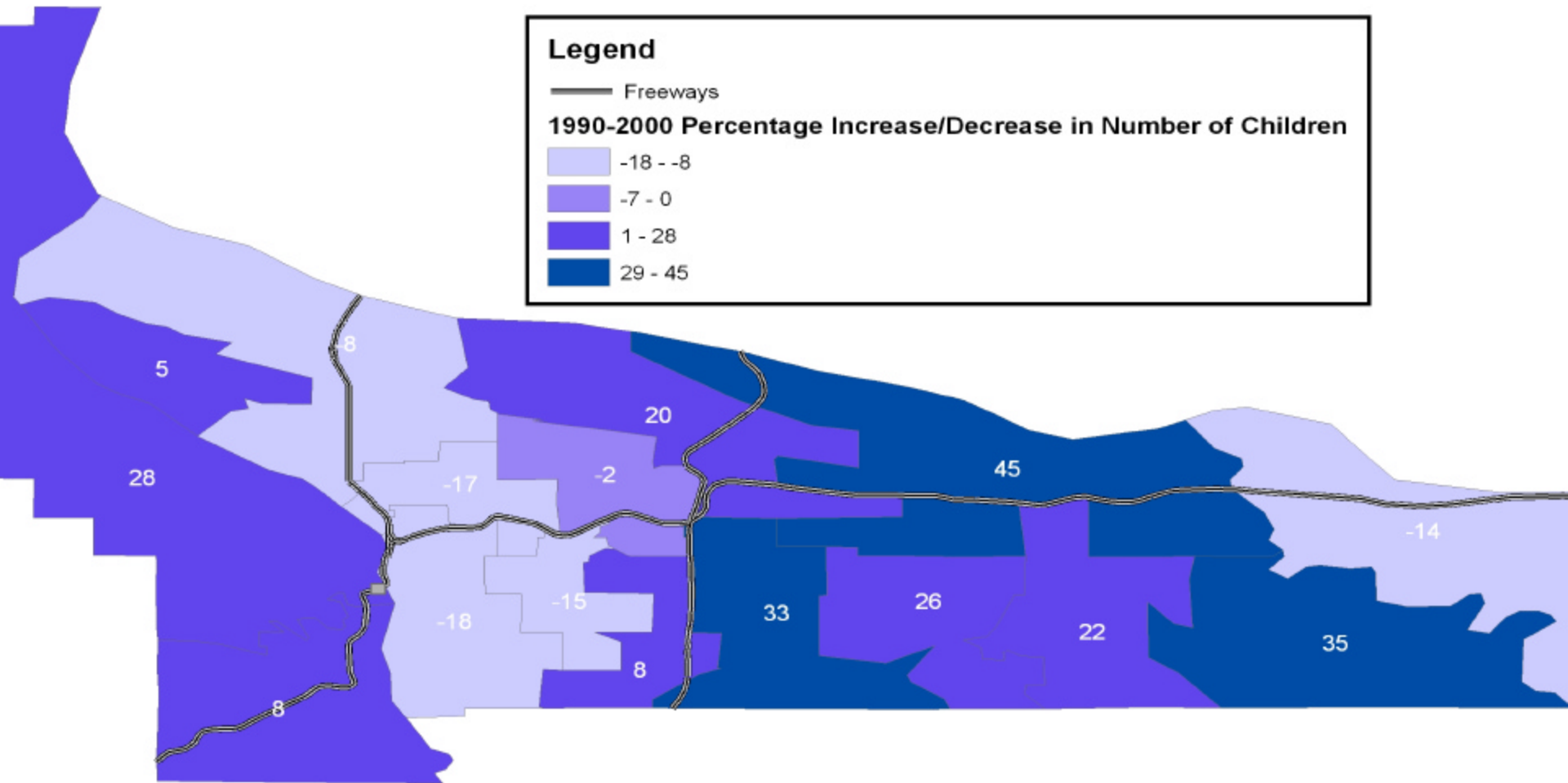

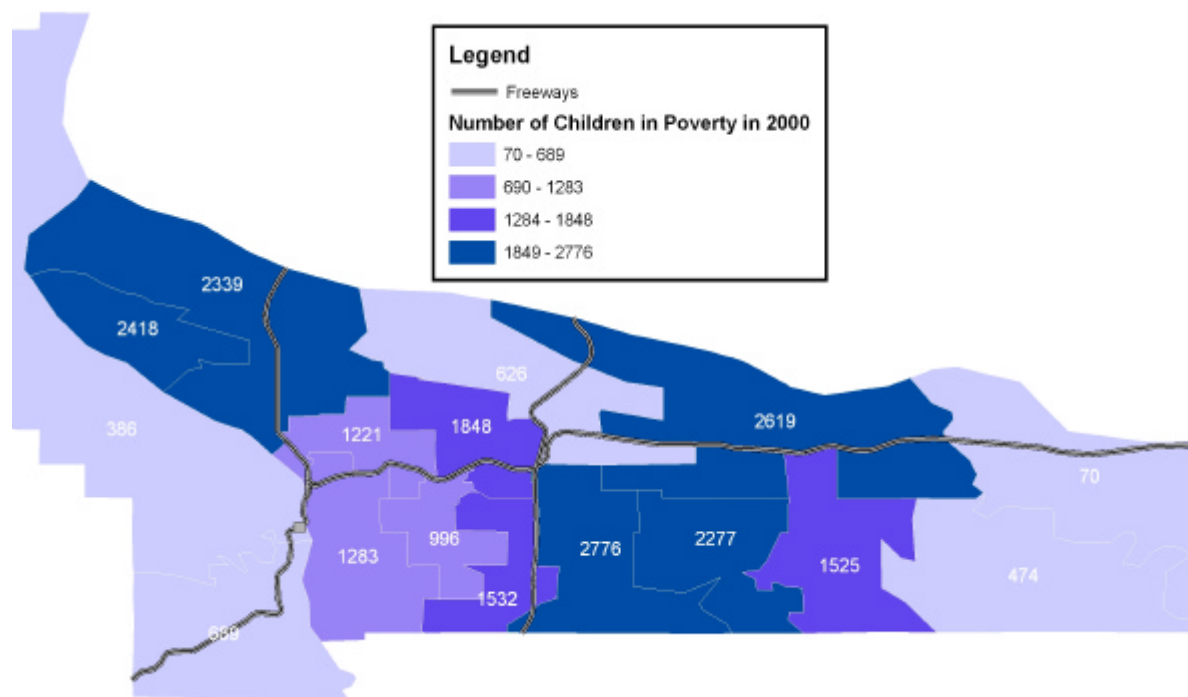
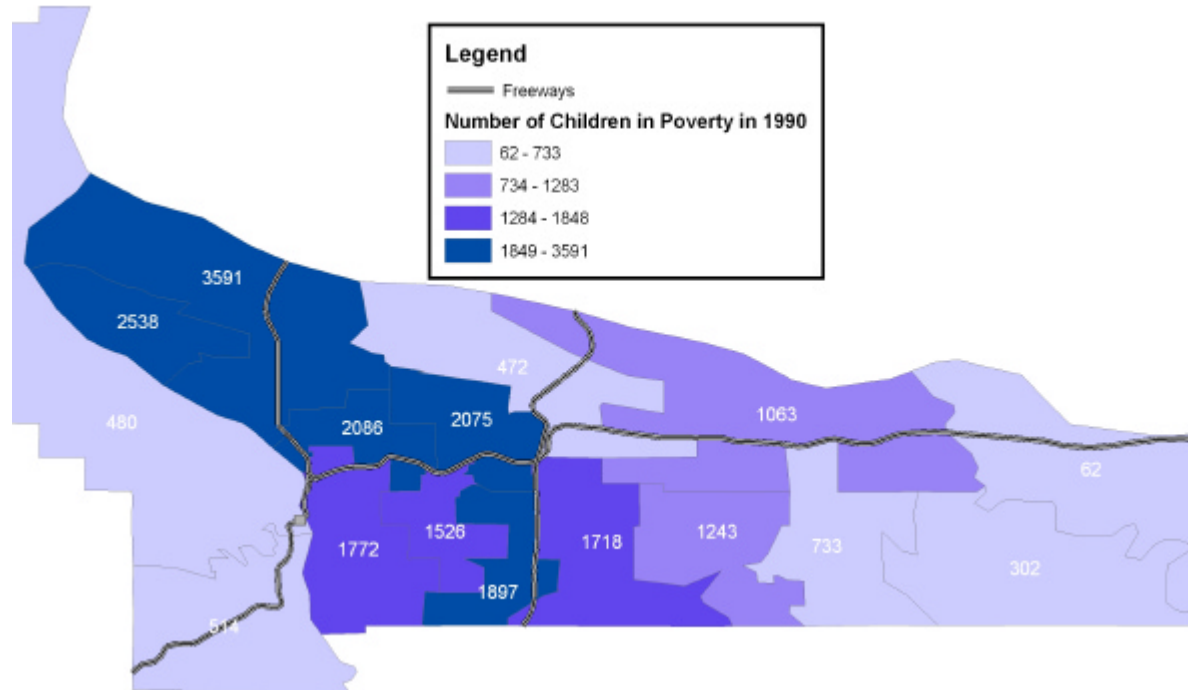

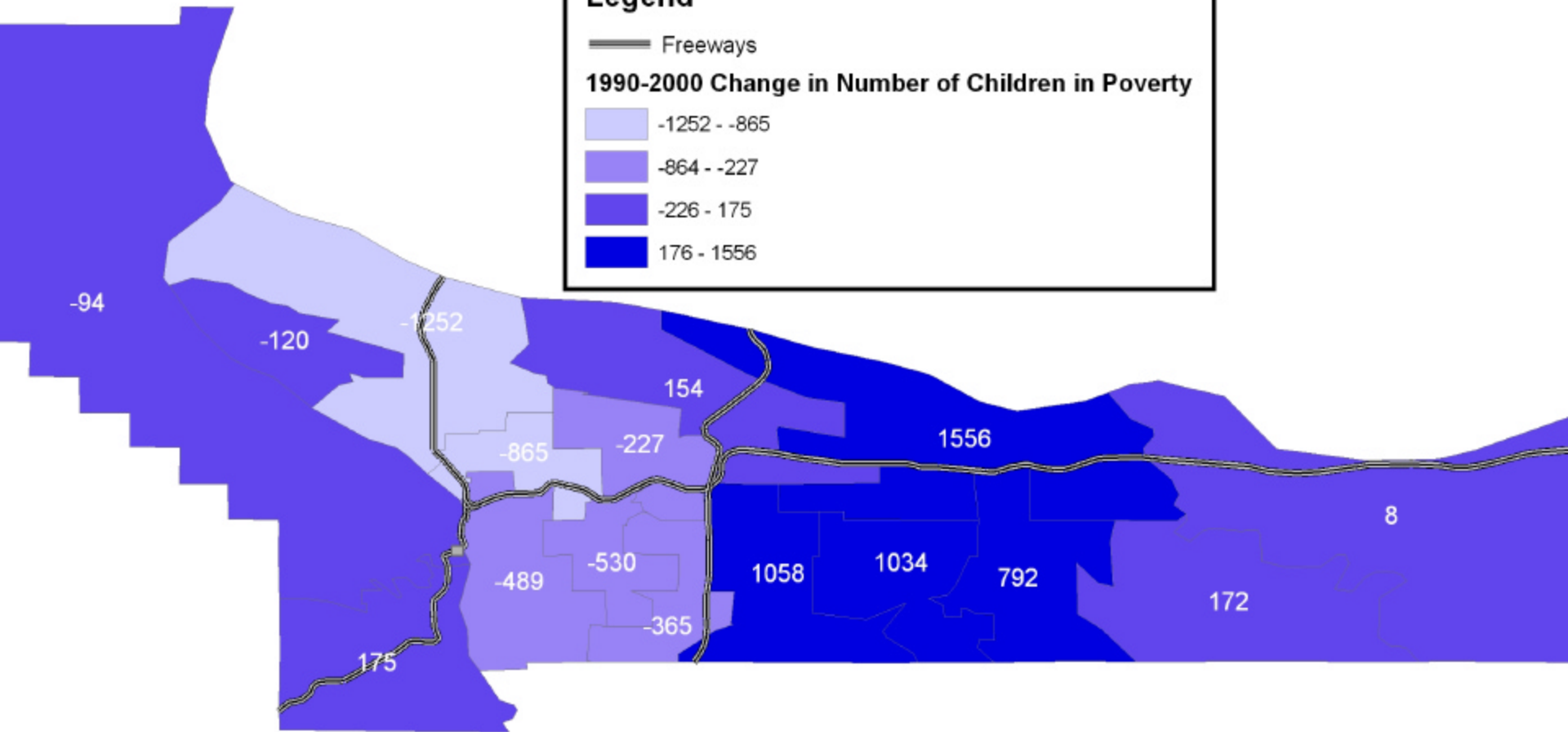

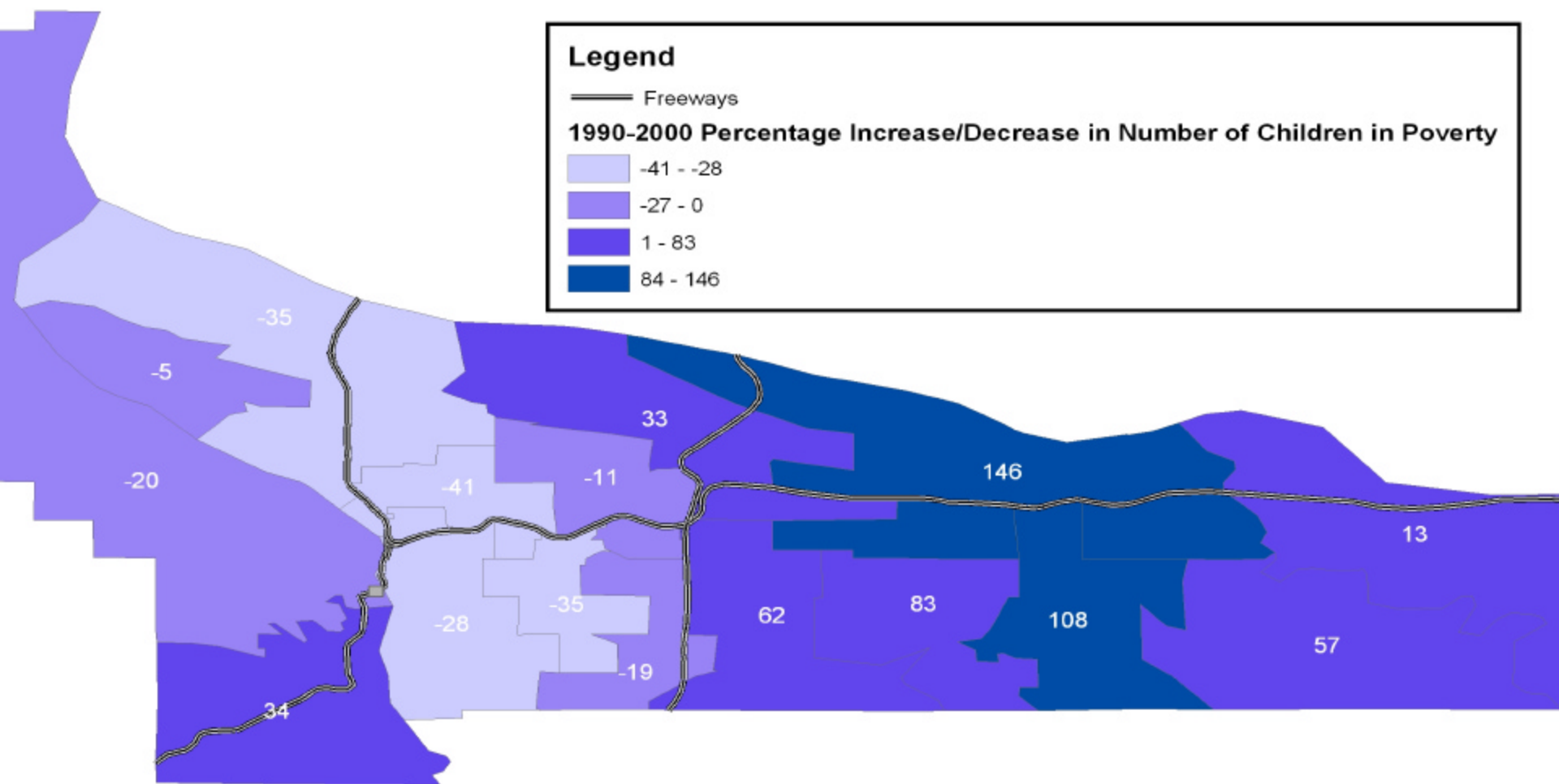
