

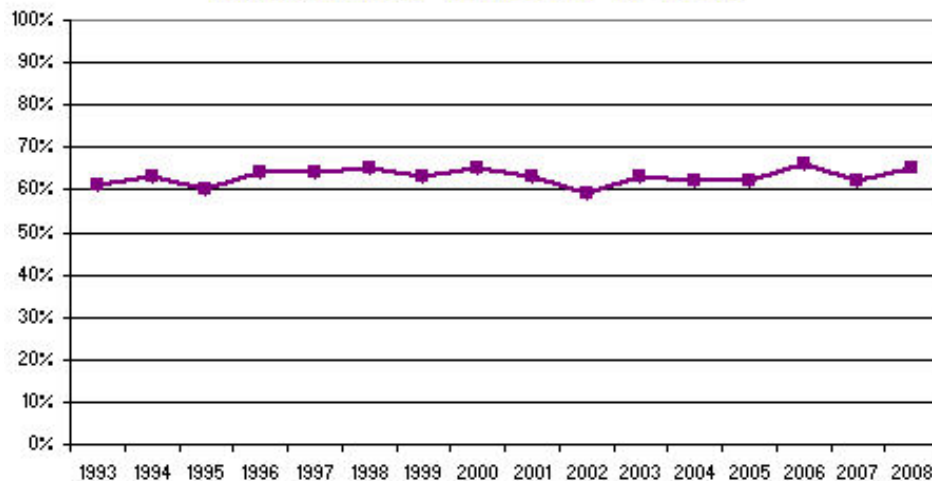

Increase the percentage of people who rate their streets acceptably clean.

In 2008 the percent of Portland residents who rate the cleanliness of their neighborhood streets as either "very good" or "good" was 65%. Over the years, it has remained fairly consistent with the mode (the number occurring most frequently) being 63%.
