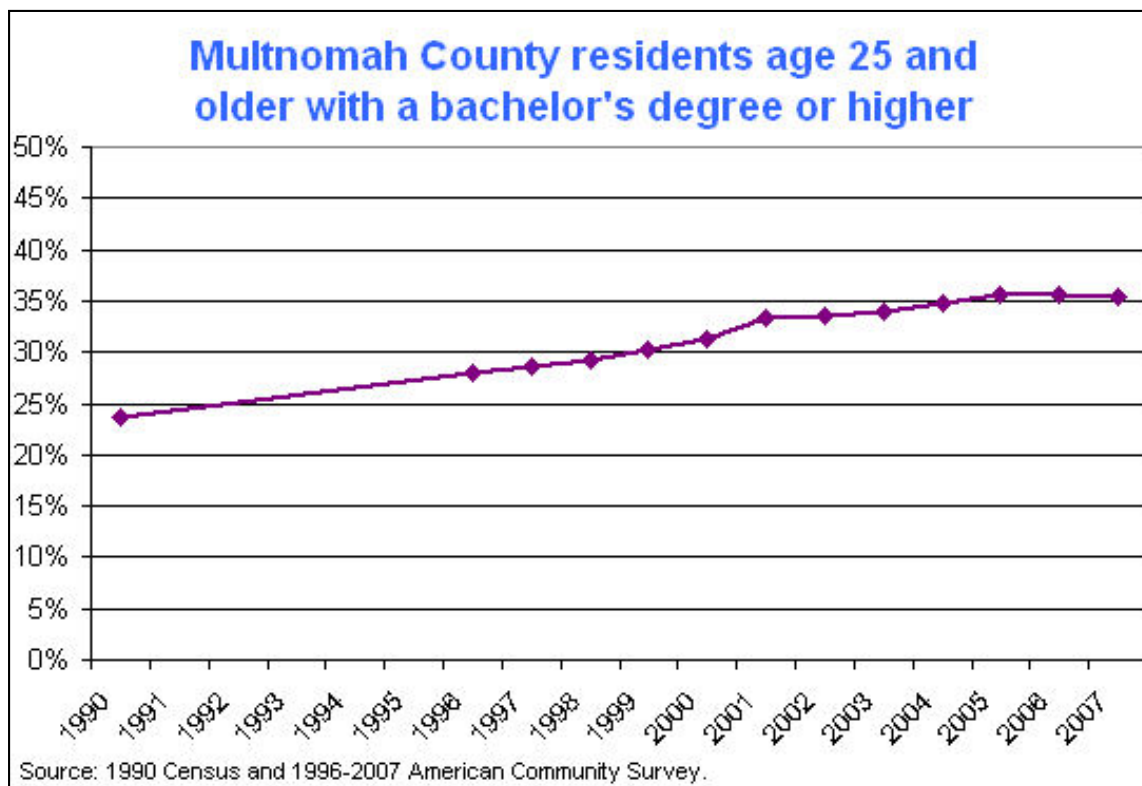


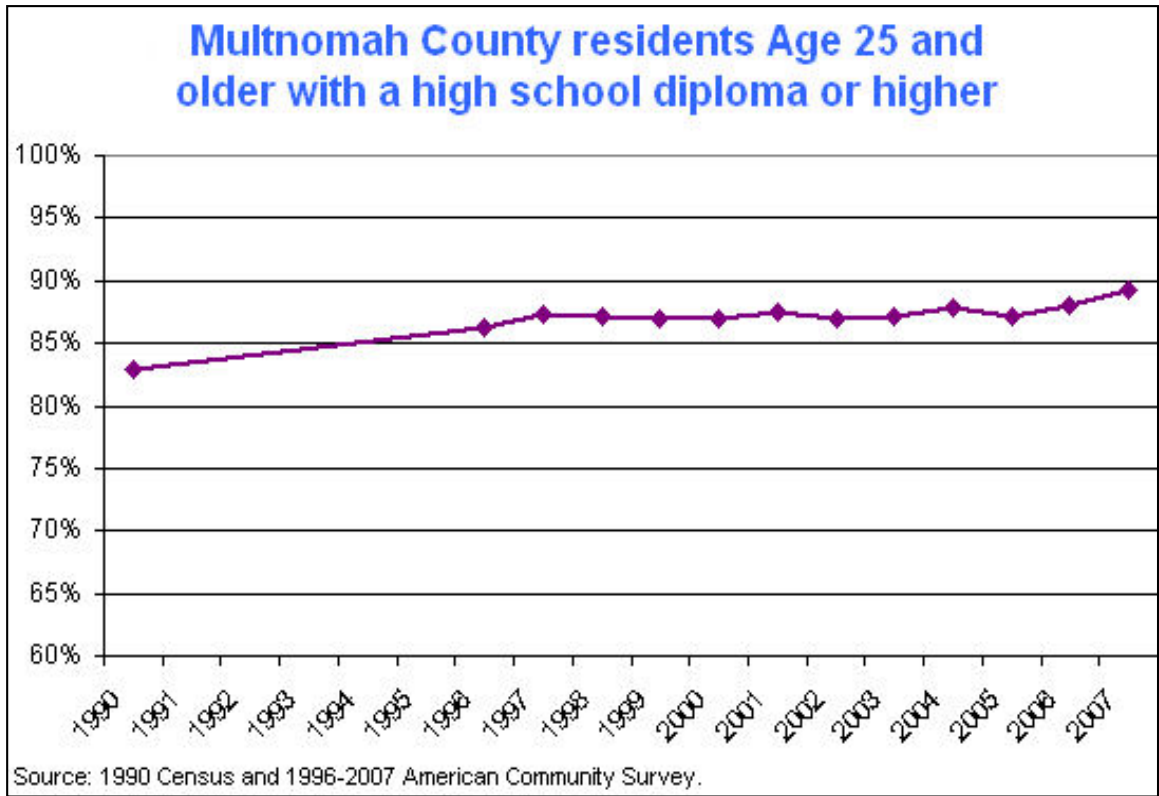

## 13 Educational Attainment - Printable Version - Edit Content

**Increase the percentage of persons 25-years-old and older who have obtained a high school diploma or higher, and increase the percentage of persons 25-years-old and older who have obtained a Bachelor's degree or higher.**

Multnomah County residents with a Bachelor's degree or higher increased steadily through the 1990's, reaching a full ten percentage points higher (34%) in 2002. That figure stood at 35% in 2007. The percentage of residents with at least a high school diploma has been fairly level for several years, oscillating between 87% and 88%. In 2007, however, it edged up to 89%.
