

AMENDMENT NO. 1CONTRACT NO. 30000065

Alliance for Community Traffic Safety

Pursuant to Ordinance No. \_\_\_\_\_

This Contract was made and entered by and between the Alliance for Community Traffic Safety, hereinafter called Contractor, and the City of Portland, a municipal corporation of the State of Oregon, by and through its duly authorized representatives, hereinafter called City.

- 1) This contract is hereby extended through December 30, 2010.
- 2) The scope of work is modified as follows:
  - a) Child Safety Seat Check-up Events at locations throughout the City of Portland each month.
  - b) Recruitment of Child Passenger Seat (CPS) technicians to assist at the Check-up Events including formalizing commitment of personnel from Legacy Health System and American Medical Response. Personal services contracts with 2 – 4 CPS Technicians. A minimum of 8 certified CPS Technicians will participate in each event and community partners will be recruited as "Greeters". A Spanish Translator to be present at all events.
  - c) Educational and promotional materials will be provided to all families attending the Check-up Events including information on how to contact the Child Safety Seat Resource Center (CSSRC). Informational fliers in English, Russian, Spanish, Vietnamese, Chinese and Somali regarding the appropriate child safety seats for children of different ages and Oregon Law are provided.
  - d) Outreach to families includes working with the Safe Routes to Schools program, listing the events on the ACTS Oregon web site and responding to inquiries over the CSSRC Clearinghouse. The CSSRC Clearinghouse telephone number is included in ODOT's Transportation Safety Division print ads and through radio and TV public service announcements.
  - e) The distribution of child safety seats to families who are low income will be offered at the Check-Up Events. The Car Seat Distribution Line through Multnomah County Health continues to be promoted as an information access point for families in need. Child safety seats will be available on a first-come first-served basis at each event at a reduced cost to low income families. Convertible, combination and booster seats are available. A co-payment is requested and funds will be used for future purchase of child safety seats. Coupons for booster seats for \$5.00 are made available through the Safe Routes to Schools program. A minimum of 25 seats are available at each Check-Up Event. Used seats replaced at the Check-Up Events will be recycled through Legacy Health System.
  - f) ACTS Oregon has funding from ODOT-Transportation Safety Division to purchase seats for families in Multnomah County. This funding is used to support the distribution of seats at the Portland Check-up Events.
- 3) Monthly Reports and invoices will be submitted to the City of Portland.
- 4) Additional compensation is necessary and shall not exceed \$14,000, per the revised Task/Compensation Schedule, above.

All other terms and conditions shall remain unchanged and in full force and effect.

## CONTRACTOR SIGNATURE:

This contract amendment may be signed in two (2) or more counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, and which, when taken together, shall constitute one and the same contract amendment.

The parties agree the City and Contractor may conduct this transaction by electronic means, including the use of electronic signatures.
