I. RECOMMENDATION

Authorize intergovernmental agreements for implementation of Grey to Green (G2G) ecoroof projects.

II. BACKGROUND

The City of Portland manages stormwater as a resource under the Portland Watershed Management Plan (PWMP). In November of 2007 Grey to Green (G2G) was launched to accelerate some principle elements of the PWMP implementation. The Bureau of Environmental Services (BES) currently has a program to construct ecoroofs. The G2G Initiative will expand and augment this existing program.

Currently, a total of seven acres of ecoroof exist within the city. The G2G initiative has a target to add an additional 43 acres of new ecoroof to the city over the next five years.

As an incentive, BES is offering up to \$5 per square foot to incent new ecoroof projects within Portland.

III. FINANCIAL IMPACT

\$40,000 is available in the Sewer System Operating Fund, FY 2009-10 Budget, Bureau of Environmental Services, [9ESWS0000055], project number [various]. Additional appropriations for FY 2010 - 13 will be available in the same operating fund.
