


Process Improvements

- Integrated, coordinated and uniform appeals procedures replaces four separate appeals processes, administered by the bureaus of Environmental Services, Transportation, Water and Parks' Forestry Division.
- Transparent appeal process posts decisions for review by development and neighborhood stakeholders, and provides regular performance reports to DRAC and Council.
- Development interests are considered at the earliest step in the appeals process.
- Citywide policy issues are captured and referred to an annual process of policy review and improvement.
- Fixed Fee of \$200 and established turnaround times provide predictability to appellants.
- Records of written appeal requests and decisions provides a basis of learning to ensure fair and consistent administration of public works policies, rules, standards and specifications.


Public Works Permit Process

Appeal Review and Hearing Bodies

Administrative Appeal Panel (PWAAP)

- 5 members 3 city members and 2 mayoral appointees. Alternates are designated to ensure full participation. Appointees serve 2-year terms.
- City bureau representatives include the Development Division Managers from the Bureaus of Environmental Services, Transportation and Water.
- A Forestry or Fire Manager is called upon when appeals relate.
- Mayoral appointees include a representative from the Development Review Advisory Committee, and a citizen with a <u>strong interest or background in</u> <u>neighborhood land use and development activities</u>.
- Mayor may solicit nominations for the Citizen appointee and alternate from chairpersons of City neighborhood association land use committees, or a neighborhood association chairperson if no land use committee exists.

Public Works Board of Appeals (PWBA)

Chief Engineers of the bureaus of Environmental Services, Transportation and Water... or their designees.

Appeal Criteria

Criteria for Appeal

- Decisions, requirements or conditions are inconsistent with or contrary to City Code, rules, standards or policy.
- The City has misapplied or misinterpreted City Code, rules, standards or policy.

Excluded from Appeal Process

- City approval or denial of requests for design exceptions.
- Decisions based on previously established City standards and specifications.
- Decisions related to the assessment of system development charges.
- Matters that are subject to the authority of any other City appeal body.
- Matters which may be appealed through City or state land use processes.
- Additional exceptions may be added as new permitting procedures are implemented.
