1) <u>Legislation Title</u>: *Accept a grant in the amount of \$10,000 from the State of Oregon, acting by and through Oregon Parks and Recreation Department, Heritage Programs for historic preservation work at Mount Tabor Gatehouse No. 1 (Ordinance)

2) <u>Purpose of the Proposed Legislation</u>: The proposed legislation will allow the concrete exterior walls on the Gatehouse at Reservoir No. 1, in the Mount Tabor Reservoirs Historic District, to be cleaned, tested for absorption, and have a breathable sealer applied in order to preserve the deteriorated concrete.

The Portland Water Bureau, (PWB), has received a grant for \$10,000 from the State of Oregon, acting by and through Oregon Parks and Recreation Department, Heritage Programs to offset the cost of completing this historic preservation work. PWB believes that acceptance of these grant funds provides a benefit to the City of Portland at the Mount Tabor Reservoirs Historic District.
