7. BACKGROUND ANALYSIS

The Neighborhood Grants Program was created to give community organizations an opportunity to build their capacity, attract new members and sustain those already involved. ONI's FY 2009-10 includes a total of \$199,106 for the fourth year of the Neighborhood Small Grants Program.

The Neighborhood Grants Program is administered through the seven Neighborhood District Coalitions funded by the Office of Neighborhood Involvement. The two City-administered neighborhood offices—East Portland Neighborhood Office and North Portland Neighborhood Services—administer their grant dollars through their non-profit organizations, respectively East Portland Neighbors and Kenton Action Plan (dba North Portland Community Works).

Each Neighborhood Coalition has been allocated a percentage of total funds (\$199,106) based upon a formula that considers the number of neighborhood associations and relative income levels. Those amounts are \$36,584 for East Portland Neighbors and \$21,479 for the Kenton Action Plan. Those two organizations have administered the grant making process and will distribute funds to the successful sub-grantees as listed in Exhibits A(1) and A(2).



8. FINANCIAL IMPACT

There is no foreseeable financial impact in passing this ordinance other than authorizing funds already included in ONI's FY 2009-10 budget.

9. RECOMMENDATION/ACTION REQUESTED

We recommend passage of this ordinance to ensure timely distribution of small grants to the neighborhood and community organizations of East and North Portland.
