## **ORDINANCE No.** 183583

Authorize an Intergovernmental Agreement with Oregon Department of Environmental Quality to collect Portland data for the Oregon 2009/2010 Waste Composition Study (Ordinance).

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. On June 28, 2006, City Council adopted Resolution No. 36423 that established the following goals for the City's solid waste and recycling system:
  - Promote sustainability of the solid waste and recycling system that includes maximum efficiency, equity and economic vitality, improved worker safety and reduced environmental and human health impacts over the entire life cycle of the materials;
  - Minimize the impact of harmful wastes by targeting toxicity and reducing greenhouse gases emissions;
  - Reduce per capita waste generation below 2005 levels by the year 2015; and
  - Maximize recovery of all waste with a target of 75% by the year 2015 and promote highest value use of the recovered materials.
- 2. Both the State of Oregon and the City of Portland have adopted aggressive waste reduction goals that rely on reducing garbage and increasing recycling for all sectors—residential, multifamily and commercial.
- 3. To evaluate success in meeting these goals, Oregon Department of Environment Quality (DEQ) periodically conducts a statewide Waste Composition Study to measure waste generation, recycling and disposal within different regions of the state.
- 4. DEQ allows local governments to obtain data specific to their region as part of the Waste Composition Study. Portland has been given the option to purchase additional data samples from waste and recycling loads generated within the City. The estimated cost for the Portland samples is \$10,500.00.
- 5. The Portland-specific data is needed to evaluate waste generation trends in Portland and the success of City programs promoting waste reduction, recycling and composting.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

a. The Mayor and the Auditor are authorized to execute an intergovernmental agreement with DEQ for the purpose described in Section 1, in the amount of up to \$10,500.00.
