7. BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS

Fiscal year 2010 financial and technical assistance is provided through the Federal Emergency Management Agency's Emergency Management Performance Grant (EMPG). These funds are provided for the development of an all hazard emergency management capability to promote preparedness, mitigation, response and recovery.

The EMPG FY 2010 Certificate states that the State Office of Emergency Management and the City of Portland Office of Emergency Management will agree to cooperate in the implementation and maintenance of an emergency management work plan.

All funds received through the EMPG program will be provided on a reimbursable basis and will be matched 50% by City of Portland general funds.

Grant funds are budgeted for one half of the cost of two management positions, one half of the annual rent for Portland OEM office space and one half of the total cost of situational analysis equipment at POEM offices.

8. FINANCIAL IMPACT

The City of Portland administers this grant. The actual cost for services and personnel would be \$367,024.00 but with the grant the actual impact would be \$183,512.00
