ORDINANCE No. 183655

* Amend the contract with TechLaw for the Urban Areas Security Initiative Resource Management Assessment and Plan for an additional scope of work and extension of contract not to exceed \$125,000 (Ordinance; amend Contract No. 30000561)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. The Federal Government has made funds available to the Portland Urban Areas for terrorism and other hazard prevention, protection, response, and recovery activities. The funding was provided under the Department of Homeland Security's (DHS) Urban Areas Security Initiative (UASI) grant program.
- 2. The State of Oregon is the grantee for the Portland Urban Area grant funds. They have contracted with the City of Portland to administer the program and funds for the urban areas.
- 3. The Urban Area Points of Contact Group (UAPOC) has identified resource management as a priority for cities and counties within the region.
- 4. Pursuant to the grant, the City of Portland advertised Bid #109912 for UASI Resource Management Assessment and Plan. The evaluation committee awarded the bid to TechLaw Inc. (contractor), during the course of the project the committee determined it was necessary to extend the contract to December 15th, 2010 and provide additional funding not to exceed \$125,000 to ensure the success of the project.
- 5. Funds will be used to amend the contract with TechLaw Inc. to complete specific research into incident organizations that can facilitate regional resource sharing and processes and systems for regional resource management; facilitate the input and involvement of at least two specialized focus groups (the 'strategy' and 'logisticians' focus groups) in the development of the plan; and specific progression of plan drafts listed in Task C, sub-section 3 of the scope-of-work.
- 6. The National Incident Management System, as mandated by the federal government, is the foundation for resource management.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

a. The Portland City Council to approve the amendment in a form substantially in accordance with the scope-of-work attached as Exhibit A between the City of Portland and TechLaw Inc for \$125,000 to further develop the UASI Resource Management Assessment and Plan.

b. The Mayor and Auditor are hereby authorized to draw and deliver checks chargeable to the UASI 2007 & 2008 grants, as agreed through the contract schedule and as deliverables are presented and approved by the Portland Office of Emergency Management and their partners in the Urban Area Security Initiative points of contact group.

Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists due to the limited time frame for the contractor to fulfill its Scope of Work as stated in the Contract and Amendment 1 between the City and the Contractor. Therefore, this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.
