7. BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS

-history of project - In 1999, the U.S. Public Health Service, Dept. of Health and Human Services (USPHS) assisted 25 of the largest metropolitan areas, including Portland, in planning and developing a Metropolitan Medical Response System (MMRS).

After providing the deliverables required in the plan, the City of Portland received a federal award of \$600,000 to purchase equipment and supply related training to first responders in a Chemical, Biological, Radiological, Nuclear, or Explosive (CBRNE) incident.

Since 2004, the City has accepted \$1,719,288 in supplemental grant funds from the Metropolitan Medical Response System to continue to build on the Regional Concept of Operations.

The Department of Homeland Security has notified PF&R that it will award an additional \$321,221 for the MMRS program.

Those governmental responders include Multnomah County Health Department, Tualatin Valley Fire & Rescue, Lake Oswego Fire Department, Vancouver Fire Department, Port of Portland Airport Fire Department, Gresham Fire Rescue & Emergency Services, and Clackamas County Fire District #1. PF&R will integrate these funds with other grants to augment needed response equipment.
