## **ORDINANCE No.** 18372.1

\*Authorize Joint Funding Agreement between the Bureau of Environmental Services and the U.S. Geological Survey, U. S. Department of the Interior for hydrologic monitoring in the Johnson Creek, Columbia Slough, Fanno Creek and Tryon Creek Watersheds. (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

## Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. This Joint Funding Agreement (JFA) with the U. S. Geological Survey (USGS) is a continuation of a cooperative study started in 1998. The JFA provides for hydrologic monitoring in the Johnson Creek watershed and operating streamgages on the Columbia Slough, Fanno Creek and Tryon Creek.
- 2. The information collected in all phases of this study will be used to enhance our understanding of the named watersheds for planning, modeling, and design purposes.
- 3. By entering into this agreement the City is leveraging its monitoring dollars through matching federal funds. The total cost of this monitoring effort is not to exceed \$1,295,140. Of this, the USGS is providing \$647,570, the City of Portland is providing \$380,810, with the balance of \$266,760 provided by the other cities and counties which are part of the Johnson Creek Interjurisdictional Committee.
- The established not to exceed cost for the City's share of the agreement is as follows: 4.

Year 1 (FY 09-10): \$69,990 Year 2 (FY 10-11): \$73,010

Year 3 (FY 11-12): \$76,090

Year 4 (FY 12-13): \$79,240

Year 5 (FY 14-15): \$82,480

Total (FY 09-10 to FY 14-15): \$380,810

- 5. The estimated cost for FY 09-10 is \$69,990. Funds are available in the Sewer System Operating Fund, FY 09-10 Budget, Bureau of Environmental Services, Cost Centers ESWS000008, ESWS000009, and ESWS000010.
- 6. Both parties understand that the availability of funds is subject to annual budget appropriations. If funds available are less than the established cost, the scope of work will be adjusted to match the available funds.

## NOW, THEREFORE, the council directs:

- The Commissioner of Public Affairs is authorized to execute a contract with the U.S. a. Geological Survey for the purpose described in Section 1, in the amount of \$380,810.
- The Commissioner of Public Affairs is authorized to execute amendments to this contract that b. do not increase the total contract amount by more than 10% of the original contract amount.

- c. The Máyor and Auditor are hereby authorized to draw and deliver warrants chargeable to the Sewer System Operating Fund Budget when demand is presented and approved by the proper authority.
- Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists because of the time critical nature of this data collection. Therefore, this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.
