Intergovernmental Agreement for Emergency Management Performance Grant (EMPG)

FY 10 CERTIFICATE

Oregon Emergency Management (OEM) and the City of Portland, Oregon, participating in the Federal Emergency Management Agency's Emergency Management Performance Grant (EMPG) program, hereby agree to cooperate in the implementation and maintenance of an emergency management program that addresses the potential hazards to the jurisdiction in accordance with the funding requirements of the EMPG program.

It is understood that funds will be made available to the City from the federal EMPG program. OEM is the administrator of EMPG funds and the entity to whom a request was submitted for funding. This certificate is the agreement between OEM and the City of Portland validating the EMPG grant award. The agreement is supported by the work plan submitted with the original application which describes the work the City will perform with the awarded grant funds (see Attachment A). The requested amount for the 2010 work plan of \$180,862.00 will be matched by an equal sum from the City. The City understands and intends that once OEM signs the Certificate there shall be a binding intergovernmental agreement between the City and OEM.

The Parties agree as follow:

Minimal basic requirements for participation in the EMPG program include the following elements numbered 1 through 5. These elements will be supported by specific activities identified in the attached Portland FY 2010 EMPG (Attachment A) that is an integral part of this agreement.

- 1. Coordination and implementation of a local integrated Emergency Management System in accordance with ORS Section 401.
- 2. Review and update emergency management plans, policies, guidelines, and standard operating procedures.
- 3. Emergency Operations Plans are to be exercised in accordance with DHS/FEMA State and Local HSEEP Exercise Requirements.
- 4. EMPG funded Emergency Management Program staff will attend a minimum of twenty (20) hours of related training during the fiscal year.
- 5. Consistent with local resources and needs, additional activities will be programmed as deemed necessary and appropriate by the Chief Executive Officer.

ADMINISTRATION

The city will submit reports as required, which list the accomplishment of activities as identified in the Emergency Management Program FY 10 Yearly Work Plan (Attachment A Portland FY10 EMPG). If a deviation from the Work Plan occurs, such will be explained in the Activity Narrative Section of the Work Plan. Where completion of an

activity involves production of a tangible product, e.g., Hazard Analysis, Emergency Guidelines, Training Agenda, etc., a copy of that product will be provided to OEM with the report of the time period in which it was produced or completed.

All funds must be spent and accounted for in accordance with 44 CFR Part 13 and 2 CFR Part 225. All funds received through the EMPG Program will be provided on a reimbursable basis. Supporting documentation for all expenses must be maintained and available on request. All reports and billing submissions must meet the timelines in the OEM Administrative Rules or a reduction in funding may occur. Exceptions will be handled on a case-by-case basis.

The Chief Executive Officer must approve the Emergency Management Program FY 10 Yearly Work Plan (Attachment A) and in the final report of the fiscal year must certify completion of the minimum requirements for EMPG funding as set forth above.

Failure to complete these minimum requirements may result in elimination of funding for the following year, a demand for the return of funds for the year covered by this agreement, or both.
