# 2) Purpose of the Proposed Legislation:

It is the intent of this agreement to assign one or more Tualatin Police Officers to Transit Police. Transit Police is managed by the Portland Police Bureau, and staffed by officers from several jurisdictions. Tualatin will pay the salaries, overtime, insurance, retirement and other benefits and indirect (overhead) charges. Tualatin will invoice TriMet for services provided by the City of Tualatin. Future staffing levels may be adjusted by agreement of the City of Portland, City of Tualatin and TriMet under the authority of the commander of the Transit Police Division.



### I. RECOMMENDATION

#### II. BACKGROUND

The Police Bureau manages TriMet Transit Police under Agreement No. 52486, "Prime Agreement" between the City and TriMet, executed August 30, 2005, as authorized by Ordinance 179499, which was passed by City Council August 5, 2005, and amended by Ordinance 181567, which was passed by City Council January 30, 2008. The Prime Agreement will expire June 30, 2010.

A new Prime Agreement will be placed on the Council Agenda for authorization for the period effective July 1, 2010 and will renew automatically for successive one-year terms through June 30, 2015 unless terminated sooner under the terms of the agreement.

The TriMet Transit Police Division includes sworn law-enforcement personnel from the City, City of Beaverton, City of Cornelius, City of Gresham, City of Hillsboro, Port of Portland, City of Tigard, City of Troutdale, City of Milwaukie, City of Tualatin, City of West Linn, City of Forest Grove, Multnomah County, Washington County and Clackamas County, which are currently provided under related subsidiary agreements.

The City of Tualatin (Tualatin) wishes to enter into a related subsidiary agreement with TriMet and the City beginning July 1, 2010 with automatic renewal for successive one-year terms through June 30, 2015, unless terminated sooner under the terms of the agreement. This

agreement will have no financial impact to the City. TriMet directly reimburses Tualatin for its costs related to the officers assigned to the Transit Police Division.
