7. BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS

Risk Management Services and the City Attorney's Office have reached a compromise settlement of a lawsuit brought by Peter Kane (through his attorney, David Stewart). The lawsuit names as defendants Wasson Properties, LLC ("Wasson") and the City of Portland. This settlement is subject to the approval of the City Council. We are recommending the City pay the total sum of \$12,500.00 to settle this lawsuit. This amount represents the City's 50% share of the total settlement amount of \$25,000.00, with the other 50% being paid by co-defendant Wasson. The 50/50 split was negotiated between the City Attorney's Office and the attorneys for Wasson.

The lawsuit arose from a bicycle accident that occurred on the afternoon of August 19, 2007. Plaintiff was riding his bicycle on SE Grand Avenue, just south of SE Spokane Avenue. This is a short section of new roadway just north of the Sellwood Bridge, in front of a newly constructed office/residential condominium building which is owned by co-defendant Wasson. Plaintiff crashed as he rode over a series of unmarked storm water control devices, which resembled speed bumps, in front of that condominium building.

Mr. Kane suffered injuries and property damage in the accident. His lawsuit sought over \$50,000 in total damages, both economic and noneconomic.

The City Attorney's Office took the position in the lawsuit that any responsibility for the unmarked hazards was with defendant Wasson. There were issues, however, about the approval process for the street design, as well as bike route marking, that led Risk Management and the City Attorney's Office to conclude that there was significant risk that the City would be held liable. Substantial settlement negotiations then took place, and ultimately led to the proposed settlement of the claim for a total of \$25,000.00, with Wasson and the City splitting the settlement on a 50/50 basis. Under all of the

circumstances, both the City Attorney's office and Risk Management conclude that settling the case for a contribution from the City of \$12,500.00 is reasonable and justified.

8. FINANCIAL IMPACT

Approval of the settlement would result in a payment of \$12,500.00 from the liability fund.
