7. BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS:

The City of Portland's (City) Workforce Training & Hiring Program is charged with providing and maximizing apprenticeship and employment opportunities for minorities and women workers in the construction trades. The City collects funds through the City's compliance-related activities and distributes grants to community non-profits that provide apprenticeship opportunities and technical assistance to further the City's Workforce Training & Hiring Program efforts.

The Bureau of Internal Business Services - Procurement Services Division, formerly known as the Bureau of Purchases, has solicited and received grant proposals from community non-profits, to provide apprenticeship opportunities and technical assistance from Oregon Tradeswomen, Inc., Irvington Covenant Community Development Corporation, Straight Path, Inc., Portland Community College - Evening Trades Apprenticeship Preparation Program, and Portland Youthbuilders. The Procurement Services Division has reviewed and recommended the issuance of grant funds to support the activities of the community non-profits.
