ORDINANCE No. 183921

* Authorize agreement with Metro to support portion of residential compost pilot program costs and exchange data (Ordinance).

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. In June, 2006 the Council adopted Resolution No. 36423 establishing goals for the solid waste and recycling system. The Council also directed the Bureau of Planning and Sustainability to prepare and submit to Council a plan to reach these goals that addresses strategies for the residential and commercial sectors as well as City government operations.
- 2. On August 8, 2007, the Council passed Resolution No. 36525 calling for the adoption of the residential and city operations portions of the Portland Recycles! Plan.
- 3. On April 30, 2008, the Council passed Resolution No. 36601 to adopt the commercial portion of the Portland Recycles! Plan.
- 4. Phase I of the residential portion of the Plan was implemented in summer 2008 and included changes to the curbside collection system with the introduction of new roll carts for recycling and yard debris.
- 5. Phase II includes adding food scraps to the yard debris collected in the green Portland Composts! roll carts and collecting this material on a weekly basis.
- 6. To implement Phase II, City Council passed Ordinance No. 183635 in March 2010, creating new categories of residential waste and recycling collection services and establishing areas within Portland where new categories of services will be made initially available.
- 7. In Ordinance No. 183635, Council also authorized the Director of the Bureau of Planning and Sustainability to expend funds from the Solid Waste Management Fund to reimburse residential solid waste franchisees participating in the initial implementation of the residential compost program for verified revenue reductions and incurred expenses arising from participation in the provision of the new services.
- 8. Metro has agreed to provide funds to the City to reimburse franchisees for the costs of handling, transporting and composting the mixed food scraps and yard debris collected in the residential compost program.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

- a. The Mayor is authorized to enter into an intergovernmental agreement with Metro in a form substantially in accordance with the agreement attached to this Ordinance for the purpose described in Section 1, in the amount of \$10,392.00.
- b. The FY 2009/2010 budget is hereby amended as follows:

<u>GRANTS FUND</u> Fund - 217007 Business Area – PN00 Bureau Program Expenses– \$0

Section 2. The Council declares an emergency exists because Metro funding is essential to support the compost pilot and such funding is only available in the current fiscal year; therefore this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.
