Ordinance No 3021

— An Ordinance declaring a surplus of assessments for the improvement of Hall Street.

The City of Portland does ordain as follows:

Sec 1. The assessments made by Ordinance No 1229 for the improvement of Hall Street, as provided by Ordinance No 1154 being more than sufficient to defray the cost thereof, the surplus of such assessments on lots, and after the amounts set forth in Section 2. of this ordinance, are hereby canceled, and the Auditor & Clerks directed to make an entry thereof in the docket of City Liens.

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Ordinance No 3022

— An Ordinance adopting the report of the City Surveyor in the matter of the proposed lateral extension of North Third Street from the north line of A Street to the north line of Ash Street, and directing an entry of the assessment hereby made in the docket of City Liens.

The City of Portland does ordain as follows:

Sec 1. The Common Council of the City of Portland, deeming it expedient to extend the front line of North Third Street to its intersection with the north line of Ash Street, did on the 3<sup>rd</sup> day of November 1880, direct the City Surveyor to make the same, make the necessary survey and make his report with plat, which said report and plat was adopted by Ordinance No 2924, entitled "An Ordinance adopting the report of the City Surveyor in the matter of the proposed lateral extension of North Third Street from the north line of A Street to the north line of Ash Street," and afterwards, to wit: on the 21<sup>st</sup> day of January 1881, the Common Council of the City of Portland, by a resolution adopted by a vote of 12 yeas to 1 nay, directed the City Surveyor to meet at the office of the Auditor & Clerks on the 2<sup>nd</sup> day of February 1881, at 10 o'clock A.M. of which day notice was given by publication in the "Daily Evening Telegram"

a newspaper of general circulation in the City of Portland, in the manner provided by Law, and said papers having first at the time said place appointed, and being duly sworn, have made said view and their report thereof including an assessment of profits & damages to certain property therein specified, which said report and assessment being satisfactory to the Common Council, is hereby adopted, of which said report the following is a copy.

To the Hon. the Common Council  
of the City of Portland  
Gentlemen.

The undersigned appointed viewers of the proposed lateral extension of North Third Street, in the City of Portland from the west line of A Street to the west line of Ash Street, by a resolution adopted by your honorable body on the 24<sup>th</sup> of July 1881.

Respectfully report that pursuant to said resolution and notice published in the Daily Evening Telegram in quest at the office of the Auditor and Clerk of the City of Portland on the 2<sup>nd</sup> day of July 1881, at 10<sup>o</sup> o'clock A.M. when we were sworn and furnished with a copy of the City Surveyor's report and plat of said lateral extension adopted by Ordinance No 2947.

After examining said report and said plat, we proceeded to view the said lateral extension of North Third Street by going over the ground and noting the condition of the said lots appropriated, we proceeded to assess determine and declare the benefits as well as the damages and advantages accruing or occasioned by the proposed lateral extension of said street, to the several lots and tracts of land hereinafter set forth as follows:

ORDINANCE NO 3043.

All Ordinances regulating the manner of appointing Engravers for the several fire Companies constituting the Portland Fire Department.

The City of Portland does ordain as follows:

Sec 1. That the General Engraver hereafter employed by the Portland Fire Department shall be appointed by the foreman of the Company employing such engraver, and shall be confirmed by the Committee on Fire and Water of the Common Council and the Chief Engraver of the Fire Department.

Sec 2. No person shall be eligible to appointment as an engraver in the Portland Fire Department without first procuring a Certificate showing him to be a competent engraver. Such Certificate shall be given by some competent engraver to be selected by the Committee on Fire and Water and the Chief Engraver.

Sec 3. Any refusal on the part of any fire Company to comply with the requirements of this Ordinance shall constitute forfeiture of their quarterly allowance.

Sec 4. This Ordinance shall apply only to engravers hereafter employed.

Sec 5. Ordinance No 2805 entitled "An Ordinance regulating the manner of appointing Engravers for the several fire Companies constituting the Portland Fire Department" is hereby repealed.
