

Ordinance No. 16636.

An Ordinance concerning offensive and disorderly conduct at public places and on public streets within the corporate limits of the City of Portland.

The City of Portland Does Ordain as Follows:

Section 1: That any person or persons who shall be guilty of disorderly conduct at public places within the corporate limits of the City of Portland, or upon the public streets of the City of Portland, by insolently and without cause accosting and without permission insolently speaking to any female over the age of fourteen years of age, while unaccompanied by escort or chaperone, or shall at public places within the City of Portland upon the public streets of the City of Portland be guilty of the act commonly known as "mashing" or shall at said places be guilty of any indecent or immoral act, or proceed in carrying out such act, shall upon conviction thereof in the Municipal Court pay a fine of not more than \$200.00, or be imprisoned in the city jail not more than 90 days, or by both such fine and imprisonment at the discretion of the court.
