1) Legislation Title:

*Amend the Intergovernmental Agreement with Clackamas County so the County may perform purchase obligations and to extend the time period for the distribution of equipment, supplies and services procured as a result of Urban Areas Security Initiative Grant FY 2009. (Ordinance; amend Contract No. 52306)

2) Purpose of the Proposed Legislation:

The purpose of this legislation is to amend an Intergovernmental Agreement with our UASI regional partner, Clackamas County, Oregon. Clackamas County is one of five counties that participate in the Urban Areas Security Initiative grant program. The other participating agencies are Clark County/Washington, Multnomah, Washington and Columbia Counties, the Port of Portland and Tri-Met. Grant funds are for the purchase and distribution of equipment, supplies and services procured as a result of Urban Areas Security Initiative (UASI) Grants. The amended IGA's will add the FY 2009 UASI award for \$6,581,436 to the UASI partnerships regional program to allow authorized purchasing by the County and extend the IGA's to April 30, 2012.

7. BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS

This ordinance is presented and requested as an Emergency Ordinance so as to maximize the grant award period of performance. The Intergovernmental Agreement is designated for a specific period of time for the procurement of equipment, regional training, planning and exercising to be funded by the Urban Areas Security Initiative Grant Program (UASI).

The City of Portland entered into Intergovernmental Agreements with five UASI counties that make up the Portland Area UASI region, which includes Clackamas County. Grant funds are for the purchase and distribution of equipment, supplies and services consistent with the Portland Urban Area Homeland Security Strategy. The IGAs are set to expire at the end of the FY 2008 grant period. The amended Clackamas County IGA will add the UASI 2009 award for \$6,581,436 to the UASI regional program and extend the IGA to April 30, 2012; in order to procure goods and services under the FY 2009 grant award period.

Regional partnerships and MOUs have previously been established which included Multnomah, Washington, Clackamas, Columbia Counties, Port of Portland and TriMet in Oregon, and also included Clark County in Washington.

8. FINANCIAL IMPACT

The City of Portland administers this grant on behalf of the UASI region. Portland receives 3% of the total UASI grant award for grant administration.

City Council to approve amending Intergovernmental Agreement with Clackamas County, one of the five UASI counties, in order to procure goods and services under the new UASI FY 2009 grant program.
