

## ORDINANCE NO. 184032

\* Apply for a \$50,000 grant from the U.S. Department of Justice, Office of Justice Programs, Bureau of Justice Assistance FY 2010 for the Gang Resistance Education and Training Program (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

1. The U.S. Department of Justice (USDOJ), Office of Justice Programs (OJP), Bureau of Justice Assistance (BJA) will provide funding for the Gang Resistance Education and Training Program.
2. The City of Portland, Oregon Police Bureau wishes to apply for \$50,000 in grant funding, which will aid in the delivery of the Elementary and Middle School curricula as well as the G.R.E.A.T. Families and Summer Components.
3. The USDOJ will reimburse the City a maximum of \$50,000 to fund program expenses, including overtime for officer instruction, travel, supplies and intra-agency expenses required to operate the G.R.E.A.T. Local program for 12 months.
4. The grant requires a 10 percent non-federal match, which will consist of additional bureau program staff time.

NOW THEREFORE, The Council directs:

- a. The Mayor is hereby authorized to make application to the U.S. Department of Justice, Office of Justice Programs, Bureau of Justice Assistance for a grant in the amount of \$50,000.
- b. The Mayor is authorized to provide such information and assurances as are required for the grant period.
- c. The OMF Grants Office is authorized to perform all administrative matters in relation to the grant application, grant agreement or amendments, requests for reimbursement from the grantor and to submit required online grant documents on the Mayor's behalf.

Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists because delay in proceeding with this application may result in not receiving funding. Therefore, this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.
