ORDINANCE No. 108068

An Ordinance authorizing execution of an agreement between the City and the Port of Portland for the rental of tie-down space for City aircraft used in insect control at the Troutdale Airport for a period of three years from July 1, 1958; authorizing the drawing and delivery of warrants at \$214.00 per year, and declaring an emergency.

The City of Portland does ordain as follows:

Section 1. The Council finds that the City presently rents base facilities for the aircraft belonging to the Bureau of Insect Control from the Port of Portland on the Portland-Troutdale Airport; that the present rental agreement expires June 30, 1958; that due to the investment the City has made in such facilities, it is desirable to continue to rent such space for a further period of three years beginning July 1, 1958; that the yearly rental for the space of approximately 130 feet by 83 feet will be \$214.00 per year, which is a reasonable rental for the space; now, therefore, the Mayor and Auditor hereby are authorized and directed to execute an agreement with the Port of Portland substantially in accordance with the form of agreement attached hereto marked Exhibit "A" and by this reference made a part of this ordinance, which agreement shall be approved as to form by the City Attorney.

Section 2. The Mayor and Auditor are hereby authorized to draw and deliver warrants in payment of the rental obligation authorized by Section 1 of this ordinance, said amounts to be chargeable to the appropriation Bureau of Insect Control (2560.325).

Section 3. Inasmuch as this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, peace and safety of the City of Portland in this: In order that the City may continue to occupy the tie-down space presently occupied at the Portland-Troutdale Airport; therefore, an emergency hereby is declared to exist and this ordinance shall be in force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.

EXHIBIT "A"

AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT entered into this _______ day of ______, 1958, by and between the CITY OF PORTLAND, a municipal corporation of the State of Oregon, hereinafter called "City", and THE PORT OF PORTLAND, a municipal corporation of the State of Oregon, hereinafter called "Port",

WITNESSETH:

For and in consideration of the mutual covenants and promises herein contained, the parties hereto covenant and agree as follows:

- 1. The Port hereby rents to the City a parcel of land on Troutdale Airport approximately 130 feet x 83 feet, hereinafter called the "Site", said site being shown on a plat hereto attached and by this reference made a part of this agreement.
- 2. The City agrees to pay to the Port the sum of \$214.00 per year as rental for the Site, said rental being determined on the basis of two cents (\$.02) per square foot per year, to the nearest dollar.
- 3. For the same consideration the Port hereby grants to the City the privilege of using the runway and taxiway and other common user facilities of Troutdale Airport for the purpose of operating aircraft operated under the control of the City, through its Bureau of Insect Control, which operation is recognized to be a public purpose.
- 4. This agreement shall remain in effect for a term beginning July 1, 1958 and ending June 30, 1961, unless extended beyond such termination date by mutual consent and agreement of the parties hereto.
- 5. The right to use the common user facilities of the airport is and shall be subject to suspension and termination by the Port at any time when the Port or any competent governmental authority deems such suspension or termination is necessary or convenient to preserve the public peace and safety; to serve military aircraft on station or maneuvers; to accommodate scheduled or special trips of certified air carriers and/or when weather or other conditions are such as to cause unusual hazards to the operation of aircraft at the Airport, or as otherwise provided in the rules.
- 6. The right of tenancy and to use of the airport, as herein provided, is at all times subject to a provision that all aircraft operated by the City and all personnel who come upon
