

## ORDINANCE No. 123660


An Ordinance transferring \$2,023.50 from General Operating Contingencies to the Bureau of Communications and Electronics for supplemental communications equipment for three fire boats, and declaring an emergency.

The City of Portland ordains:


Section 1. The Council finds that during the Kerr Grain Elevator fire on October 11, 1966, radio communication to the three fire boats was disrupted because of the extremely high ambient noise level encountered when the boats were pumping; that tests have been conducted on fire boat #2 in order to establish what is required to overcome the problem; that the City Communications Director has recommended installation of supplemental communication equipment which would cost \$2,023.50; and that it would be in the best interest of the City of Portland to provide funds for this equipment without delay; now, therefore, the sum of \$2,023.50 is hereby transferred within the General Fund from the appropriation General Operating Contingencies (4100) to the appropriation Bureau of Communications and Electronics, Equipment, (200.720) for supplemental communications equipment necessary to overcome the problem of communication to the three fire boats.

Section 2. Inasmuch as this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, peace and safety of the City of Portland in this: That it is necessary to provide funds without delay for communications equipment on the three fire boats as authorized in Section 1 of this ordinance; therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this ordinance shall be in force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.
