Planning Process


- 11-person steering committee (representatives from neighborhood groups, interested citizens and PP&R staff)
- Two open houses
- Briefing for Powellhurst Gilbert NA
- Revisions and review by new Leach Friends board and original steering committee

Background and Significance

- Acquired by PP&R in 1982
- Built around the home and garden of John and Lilla Leach, renowned botanist of the 30s and 40s
- Botanical treasure
- One of few publicly-owned green spaces in SE Portland (currently 16 acres)
- · Important natural resource habitat

Role & Function of the Garden

- A botanical garden that focuses on plants of the Pacific Northwest and the historic Leach collection
- · An educational resource
- A *museum* that displays and educates visitors about John and Lilla Leach




Proposed Site Concepts

• Develop a new entry to the garden.





• Develop the upper part of the garden as an educational area that can accommodate individuals, small groups, and classes.







• Expand the garden's new collections into the upper area and to the east.

• Expand the trail and circulation system throughout the garden.

Plant Collections

The Upper Garden

• Add new plant collections to include a children's garden, a display garden, and demonstration beds.



The Pacific Northwest Forest

• Expand the Pacific NW native forest collection, including the cedar forest and enhance the riparian zone as a wetland area.

The Riparian Zone

• Maintain and enhance the riparian zone along Johnson Creek as a wetland area with limited trail access, especially in the eastern third of the garden.





Nursery

- · Maintain in its present location.
- · Develop an area for selling plants.
- Develop as a source of scientific information.
- Develop a demonstration greenhouse.

Historic Leach Plant Collection

Strengthen the integrity of the historic Leach collection by:

- Thinning surrounding woods
- Relocating part of the collection to the east and north expansion areas.

Maintain the garden's emphasis on indigenous plants of the Pacific NW by:

- Expanding the forest collection, developing a cedar grove,
- Enhancing riparian & wetland areas
- Developing a Willamette Valley Prairie collection



Education

Expand & improve educational opportunities at the garden.





Develop a system of interpretive signs that are informative & engage visitors in an imaginative way.

Facilities

Manor House

- · Continue to use for receptions.
- Restore structure to reflect its 1930s heritage & update.
- Develop as museum to document the contributions of John & Lilla Leach.



Education Facility

- Develop an education facility in the upper garden that will have the capacity to accommodate small groups.
- · Develop an open-air structure as an interim education facility.

Administration Building

• Improve & update to function as office space & a classroom.

Stone Cabin

- Renovate to be usable for education programs.
- Develop a covered shelter for outdoor classes.

Stone Residence

• Renovate as an open air structure for classes and picnics.

Carriage House

• Renovate as storage facility.





Outdoor Shelters

• Construct two shelters to be used for educational programs.

Access & Parking

Parking

- Develop a new vehicle & pedestrian entry at the intersection of SE 122nd
 & SE Claybourne.
- Explore redevelopment of the lower parking lot.

Circulation

- Develop network of paths that preserves & enhances the garden's beauty, topography, plantings, & views.
- Improve paths to accommodate at least two people walking abreast, where possible.

Johnson Creek Pedestrian Bridge

• Develop new pedestrian connection between north & south sides of Johnson Creek.

Accessible Trail

• Develop fully accessible pedestrian trail to connect upper & lower gardens.

Acquisition

Acquire property north and east of the garden to expand the collection and provide a caretaker residence.
